- I. The Name of the Company is **STAREX FOUNDATION**
- II. The Registered Office of the Company will be situated in the National Capital Territory of Delhi.
- III. The objects for which the Company is established are :-

Me-STARE

**(A) MAIN OBJECTS TO BE PURSUED BY COMPANY ON ITS INCORPORATION
ARE :-**

1. To promote, establish and impart education, research & training, vocation by way of running / operating / maintaining / managing / constructing / developing schools, ashrams, gurukuls, colleges, institutes to impart and disseminate knowledge in natural, physical, medical, social and information sciences and in management, law, commerce, arts, crafts, culture, sports, fashion, entertainment, media either online, distance learning or through traditional method of studies in India not for the motive of profit.
2. No objects of the company will be carried out without obtaining prior approval/NOC from the concerned authority wherever required.
3. None of the objects of the company will be carried out on commercial basis.



(B) INCIDENTAL AND ANCILLARY OBJECTS :-

The objects incidental or ancillary to the attainment of the Main Objects are:

1. To establish online education centre, language course, courses for personality development, cultural activity centres for primary students for imparting activities in the arts like dance, music, drama, painting, singing, sports, provide, maintain and run training and vocational and hobby institutes.
2. To advise, promote, organize and facilitate coaching, events, cultural activities, fares, competition, scholarships, sponsorships, social welfare services on all matters relating to education, entertainment, sports, art & crafts, culture and other branches of knowledge in India.
3. To establish, promote, run and manage hostel or any other type of boarding and/or lodging facilities for persons pursuing any course of studies or engaged in research in any branch of knowledge, and to provide similar facilities to outstanding and needy persons related to education and research in any branch of knowledge.
4. To co-operate, collaborate and assist other institutions including universities and research centres in India and other parts of the world in furtherance of the objects of the Company.
5. To institute and award fellowships, prizes, medals, diplomas, certificates and the like, for the furtherance of the above-mentioned objects.
6. To print, publish, develop, make and distribute studies, reports, films, compact discs (audio, video and digital) and other publications and journals and establish libraries and information systems for the processing, publishing and selling and dissemination of research products in furtherance of the objects.
7. To purchase, acquire and own or take on lease or hire, temporarily or permanently, any movable or immovable property necessary or convenient in furtherance of the objects of the company and to deal with the same in any manner whatsoever.
8. To build, construct, maintain, repair, alter, improve or develop or furnish and build or furnish any building or works considered necessary or convenient.
9. To retain or employ skilled, professional or technical advisers and other staff and workers in connection with the objects of the Company and to pay therefor such fees or remuneration as may be considered expedient.

10. To institute provident fund, gratuity, family pension or any other payments for the benefit of the staff.
11. To enter into any arrangement with any corporation or local body or authority or government or any other institution in India or abroad and to obtain from them licenses, rights, privileges, concessions as may be deemed desirable for attaining the objects of the company.
12. To utilize and exploit the result of research and to get patent rights and copyrights in respect of discoveries, inventions, innovations and processes developed by the Company.
13. To apply to the government, public bodies, urban, local, municipal, district and other bodies, corporations, companies or legal persons, for and to accept grants whether in cash and securities, and of any property in either movable or immovable form, donations, gifts, subscriptions and other assistance with a view to promoting the objects of the Company and to conform to the conditions on which such grants and other payments may be received.
14. To establish, maintain, control and manage branches of the Company in India and elsewhere.
15. To borrow or raise any money that may be required by the Company upon such terms as may be deemed advisable, and in particular by the issue of bills of exchange, promissory notes or other obligations or securities or by mortgage or charge of all or any parts of the property of the Company; and to purchase, redeem or pay off any such obligations or securities.
16. To draw, make, accept, endorse, discount, execute and issue promissory notes, bills of exchange and other negotiable or transferable instruments.
17. To invest the funds of the Company not immediately required in or upon any investments or properties of whatsoever nature and wherever situated, including securities, flats, lands and buildings, and to sell, call in, vary, exchange or transfer any investment or property.
18. To pay all expenses, preliminary or incidental to the setting up of any centre, institute, schools, colleges or any other institution in furtherance of the objects of the Company.
19. To procure the Company to be registered or recognized legally under any law in any part of India.
20. Organise, sponsor, establish, conduct, undertake and promote whatever activities are considered necessary for achievement of the above objects.
21. To do all such other lawful things as may be necessary, incidental or conducive for the attainment of the above objects.

Provided that the Company shall not support with its funds, or endeavour to impose on, or procure to be observed by, its members or others, any regulation or restriction which, if on object of the Company, would make it a Trade Union.

(C) OTHER OBJECTS ARE NIL

- IV) The objects of the association extend to whole of India.
- V) 1) The income and property of the association, whensoever derived, shall be applied solely for the promotion of its objects as set forth in this Memorandum.
- 2) No portion of the income or property aforesaid shall be paid or transferred directly & indirectly by way of dividend, bonus or otherwise by way of profits to persons who at any time are, or have been member of the company or to any one or more of them or to any persons claiming through any one or more of them.
- 3) Except with the previous approval of the central government no remuneration or other benefit in money or moneys worth shall be given by the association to any of its members, whether officers or servants of the company or not, except payment of out of pocket expenses, reasonable and proper interest on money lent or reasonable, and proper rent on premises let to the association.
- 4) Except with the previous approval of the Central Government no member shall be appointed to any office under the association, which is remunerated by salary, fees, or in any other manner not excepted by sub-clause(3).
- 5) Nothing in this clause shall prevent the payment by the association in good faith of reasonable remuneration to any of its officers or servant (not being members) or to any other person in return for any services actually rendered to the company.
- VI) No alteration shall be made to this Memorandum of Association or to the Articles of Association of the Company, which are for the time being in force, unless the alteration has been previously submitted to and approved by the Regional Director.
- VII) The liability of the members is limited.
- VIII) Each member undertakes to contribute to the assets of the company in the event of its being wound up while he is a member or within one year after wards for payment of the debts or liabilities of the company contracted before he ceases to be a member and of the costs, charges and expenses of winding up and adjustment of the rights of the contributories among themselves such amount as may be required not exceeding a sum of Rs. 5000.

- IX) True accounts shall be kept of all sums of money received and expended by the company and the matters in respect of which such receipts and expenditure take place, and of the property, credits and liabilities of the company; and, subject to any reasonable restrictions or to the time and manner of inspecting the same that may be imposed in accordance with the regulations of the company, time being in force, the account shall be open to the inspection of the members. Once at least in every year, the accounts of the company shall be examined and the correctness of the balance sheet and the income and expenditure account ascertained by one or more properly qualified auditor or auditors.
- X) If upon winding-up or dissolution of the company, there remains, after the satisfaction of all the debts and liabilities, any property whatsoever, the same shall not be distributed amongst the members of the company but shall be given or transferred to such other company registered u/s 25 of the Companies Act having objects similar to the objects of this Company, to be determined by the members of the company at or before the time of dissolution or in default, thereof, by the High Court of Judicature that has or may acquire jurisdiction in the matter.

OF

STAREX FOUNDATION

(A Company Limited by guarantee not having share capital not for profit under section 25 of the companies Act, 1956)

PRELIMINARY

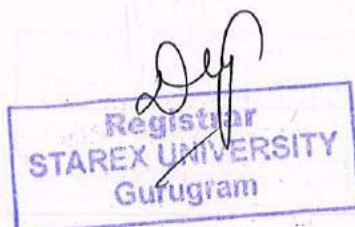
1. Subject as here in after provided the Regulations contained in Table 'C' in the first schedule to the company Act, 1956 shall apply to the company.

INTERPRETATION

2. (1) In these Regulations:-
 - a) "Company" means **STAREX FOUNDATION**
 - b) "Office" means the Registered Office of the Company.
 - c) "Act" means the Companies Act, 1956, and any statutory modification thereof.
 - d) "Seal" means the Common Seal of the Company.
 - e) "Directors" means the Directors of the Company and includes persons occupying the position of the Directors by whatever names called.
- (2) Unless the context otherwise requires words or expressions contained in these Articles shall be the same meaning as in the Act, or any statutory modification thereof in force at the date at which these Articles become binding on the Company.

PRIVATE COMPANY

3. The Company is a Private Company within the meaning of Section 3(1) (iii) and 2(35) of the Companies Act, 1956 and accordingly: -
 - (a) The number of members of the Company (exclusive of persons who are in the employment of the Company, and persons who having been formerly in the employment of the Company, were members of the Company while in the employment and have continued to be members



after the employment ceased) shall be limited to fifty; provided that for the purpose of this definition where two or more persons jointly hold one or more shares in the Company, they shall, be treated as a single member, and.

- (b) Prohibits any invitation or acceptance of deposits from persons other than its members, directors and relatives.

MEMBERS

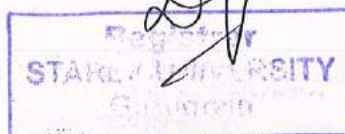
4. The subscribers to the Memorandum and such other person as the Board of Directors shall admit to membership shall be members of the Company.
5. The company shall keep at its registered office a register to be called "Register of Member." The names and other particulars of all members of the company shall be entered in the register.
6. Any member who becomes unsound mind maybe removed immediately by the majority vote of the other members.

VOTE OF MEMBERS

7. (1) Every member shall have one vote.
- (2) On a show of hands, or poll Every member whose name appears in the register of members and who is not otherwise disqualified shall have one vote.
- (3) All resolutions, except where the law requires a greater majority shall be adopted by a simple majority vote of the members of the company.
8. A vote given in accordance with the term of an instruments of proxy shall be valid, notwithstanding the previous death or insanity or the principal or the revocation of the proxy or of the authority under which the proxy was executed.

Provided that no intimation in writing of such death, insanity, revocation or transfer shall have been received by the company at its office before the commencement of the meeting or adjourned meeting where the proxy is used.

9. In the case of an equality of votes no a poll, the chairman of the meeting at which the poll takes, place, or at which the poll is demanded, shall be entitled to a second or casting vote.
- 10: (1) No objection shall be raised to the qualification of any voter except at the meeting or adjourned meeting at which the vote objected is disallowed at such meeting shall be valid for all purpose.
- (2) Any objection made in due time shall be referred to the chairman of the meeting whose decision shall be final and conclusive.



11. A vote given in accordance with the term of an instrument of proxy shall be valid, notwithstanding the previous death or insanity of the principal or the revocation of the proxy or of the authority under which the proxy was executed.


Provided that no intimation in writing of such death, insanity, revocation or transfer shall have been received by the company at its office before the commencement of the meeting or adjourned meeting where the proxy is used.

GENERAL MEETINGS

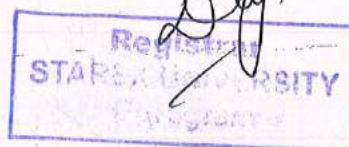
12. All General Meetings other than the Annual General Meeting shall be called Extra-ordinary General Meetings.
13. (a) The Board may whenever it thinks fit, call an Extra-ordinary General Meetings.
- (b) If at any time there are not within India directors capable of acting who are sufficient in number to form a quorum, any Director or at least any two members of the Company may call an Extra-ordinary General Meeting in the same manner, as nearly as possible, as that a meeting may be called by the Board.
14. At least twenty-one days, clear notice of General Meetings of the Company, specifying the day, hour and place of meeting and the objects shall be given. In every such notice calling meeting of the Company there will appear a statement that member is entitled to appoint proxy to attend and to vote instead of himself. A General Meeting may be called after giving a notice shorter than twenty-one days if consent is accorded in case of any general meeting of all the members entitled to vote there at.
15. No business shall be transacted at any general meeting, unless quorum of members in present. At least two members present in person shall be quorum for general meeting.
16. The Chairman, if any, of the Board, shall preside as Chairman of all Board and general meetings, of the Company. If at any time the Chairman is not present within 15 minutes after the time appointed for holding the same, the Directors and members present shall elect one of the Directors present to be Chairman of such meeting. If no director is present or unwilling to act as Chairman, the members may appoint one of their members as Chairman.

DIRECTORS

17. The number of Directors shall not be less than two and not more than twelve.
18. The following shall be the First Directors of the Company.

 2. ISHVIEN MOHINDER SINGH

19. The Directors may from time to time, appoint one or more of their body to the office of the Managing Director of the Company and to enter into agreement with him in such terms and conditions as they may deem fit.
20. The Directors shall have the power, at any time and from time to time, to appoint any person as additional Director in addition to the existing Director so that the total number of Directors shall not at any time exceed the number fixed for Directors in these articles, Any Directors so appointed shall hold office only until the next following Annual General Meeting but shall be eligible thereof for election as Director.
21. The Managing Director not being member may be paid such remuneration as may, from time to time, be determined by the Board.
22. The quorum necessary for the transaction, of the business of the Board meeting subject to Section 287 of the Act, shall be one third of the total strength or at least two whichever is higher.
23. Subject to section 289 of the Act, a resolution in writing signed by the Director except a resolution which the Act specifically required it to be passed at a Board meeting shall be effective for all purposes as a resolution passed at a meeting of Directors duly called, held and constituted.
24. Subject to provisions of Section 313 of the Act, a Director, who may be absent for a period, not less than 3 (three) months from the State in which the meeting of the Board are ordinarily held, have power to appoint any member of the Company elected by him as an alternate director by giving notice in writing under his name to the Board and at his discretion to remove, such alternate director. Such alternate Director shall vacate office when his appointee is present in person or cease to be director. Save as aforesaid such alternate director while so acting shall exercise and discharge all functions and powers and be subject to all the duties and limitations of the Director which he represents and shall be entitled to receive notice to attend and to vote a Director's Meeting on behalf of meeting attended by him.
25. The Director shall have power for engagement and dismissal of managers, engineers, assistants, clerks and others and shall have power of general direction, and management and superintendence, of the activities of the company with full powers to do all such acts, matters and things deemed necessary, proper or expedient for carrying on the activities and concern of the Company including the power to make such investment of the Company's fund as they shall think fit, subject to the limit fixed by the Board of Directors under Section 292 of the Act and sign contracts and to draw, make, sign, accept, endorse and negotiate on behalf of the Company all bills of exchange, promissory notes, hundies drafts, Government Promissory Notes and other Government securities and such other instruments.



26. The Director may delegate all or any of their powers to such other Directors, Managers or other persons as they think fit and shall have power to grant to any such person such power of attorney, as they deem expedient and such powers at pleasure to revoke, subject to Section 292 and 312 of the Companies Act, 1956.

POWERS AND DUTIES OF DIRECTORS

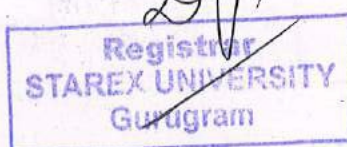
27. The business of the Company shall be managed by the Board of Directors who may pay all such expenses preliminary and incidental to the promotion, formation, establishment and registration of the Company as they think fit and may exercise all such power of the Company and do on behalf of the Company all such acts as may be exercised or done by the Company in general meeting and are not barred by statute or by these Articles and are required to be exercised or done by the Company in General Meeting, subject nevertheless to any regulations of the Articles, to the provisions of the statute and to such regulations not being inconsistent with aforesaid regulations or provisions as may be prescribed by the Company in general meeting but no regulation made by the Company general meeting shall invalidate any prior act of the Directors which would have been valid if such regulations had not been made.

CHAIRMAN

28. The Board shall by simple majority vote, appoint one of them to be the Chairman of the company and determine the period for which he shall hold the office and may, from time to time, subject to the provisions of any contract between him and the company remove or dismiss him from that office and appoint another in his place.
29. The Chairman shall, subject to the provisions of any contract between him and the company, be subject to the same provisions as to resignation and removal as the other Directors and he shall, ipso facto, cease to be the Chairman, if he ceases to hold the office of Director for any cause.
30. The Chairman may as a Director of the Company under these Articles, will not receive any remuneration from the company.

MANAGEMENT

31. The Directors may appoint one or more of their members to act as Chairman, Managing Directors or Executive Directors or full time working Directors on honorary basis and no remuneration will be given to the members of the company.
32. The activities of the Company shall be carried on by the Board of Directors through the Chairman and/or its other members, and/or any other person appointed by the Board of Directors for this purpose, and/or such other manner as they shall think fit, subject always to the direction, control and supervision of the Board of Directors:
- (i) To issue or grant any surety, indemnity or guarantee for or on behalf of the company;



BORROWING POWERS

33. Subject to section 58-A and 292 of the Companies Act, 1956, and Regulations made thereunder and Directions issued by the RBI the directors may, from time to time, raise or borrow any sums of money for and on behalf of the Company from the member or other persons, companies or banks or they may themselves advance money to the company on such interest as may be approved by the Directors.
34. The Directors may, from time to time, secure the payment of such money in such manner and upon such terms and conditions in all respects as they deem fit and in particular by of pledge, mortgage, charge or any other security on all or any properties of the Company (both present and future).

OPERATION OF BANK ACCOUNTS

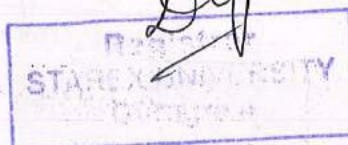
35. The Directors shall have the power to open bank accounts to sign cheques on behalf of the Company and to operate all banking accounts of the Company and to receive payments, make endorsements, draw and accept negotiable instruments, hundies and bills or may authorise any other person or persons to exercise such powers.

ACCOUNTS

36. a) The Board shall, from time to time, determine whether and to what extent and at what times and places and under what conditions or regulation the accounts and books of the Company or any of them shall be open to the inspection of members (not being Director).
- b) No members (not being Director) shall have any right of inspecting any accounts or books of account of the Company except as conferred by law or authorised by the Board or by the Company in General Meeting.
37. The Directors shall in all respect comply with the provisions of Section 209, 209A, 210, 211, 215, 216, 217, 218, 220, 221 and 222 of the Act, and incomes expenditure account, Balance Sheet and Auditors Report and every other document required by law to annexed or attached as the case may be, to the Balance Sheet, to be sent to every member and of the Company and at least twenty one days before the date of Annual general meeting of the Company at which they are to be laid, subject to the provisions of section 219 of the Act.

AUDIT

38. (a) The first Auditor of the Company shall be appointed by the Board of Directors within one month from the date of registration of the Company and the Auditors so appointed shall hold office until the conclusion of the first Annual General Meeting.
- (b) At each annual General Meeting the Company shall appoint an Auditor to hold Office from the conclusion of the Meeting till the conclusion of the next Annual General Meeting.



- (c) The remuneration of the Auditor shall be fixed by the Company in the Annual General Meeting or in such manner as the Company in the Annual General Meeting may determine. In case of an Auditor appointed by the Board his remuneration shall be fixed by the Board.

COMMON SEAL

39. (a) The Common Seal of the Company may be made either of metal or of rubber as the directors may decide.
- (b) The Board shall provide for the safe custody of the Company's Common Seal.
- (c) The Seal shall not be affixed to any instrument except by the authority of a resolution of the Board or of a Committee of the Board authorised by it in that behalf and except in the presence of at least one director who shall sign every instruments to which the seal of the Company if so affixed. The share certificate will, however, be signed and Sealed in accordance with Rule 6 of the Companies (Issue of Share Certificates) Rules, 1960.

SECRECY

40. Subject to the provisions of law of land and the act, every manager, auditor trustee, member of a committee, officer servant, agent accountant or other persons employed in the business of the company shall, if so required by the Board of Directors before entering upon his duties, sign, declaration, pledging himself to observe strict secrecy respecting all transactions of the Company with its customers and the state of account with individuals and in matters relating thereto and shall by such declaration pledge himself, not to reveal any of the matters which may come to his knowledge in the discharge of his duties except when required to do so by the directors or by any court of law and except so far as may be necessary in order to comply with any of the provisions in these presents.

INDEMNITY

41. Subject to the provisions of Section 201 of the Act, every Director, Manager, Auditor, Secretary and other officers or servants of the Company shall be indemnified, out of the assets of the Company against any bonafide liability incurred by him in defending any bonafide proceedings, whether civil or criminal, in which judgment is given in his favour or in which he is acquired or in connection with any application under section 633 of the Act, in which relief is granted to him by the Court.

THE HARYANA PRIVATE UNIVERSITIES, 2006
(as amended upto 10th May 2012)

AN

ACT

to provide for establishment and incorporation of private universities in the State of Haryana for imparting higher education and to regulate their functions and for matters connected therewith or incidental thereto.

Short title, extent and commencement.

1. (1) This Act may be called the Haryana Private Universities Act, 2006.

(2) It extends to the whole of the State of Haryana.

(3) It shall come into force at once.

Definitions.

2. In this Act and in all the Statutes, Ordinances and Regulations made hereunder, unless the context otherwise requires,-

(a) "All India Council for Technical Education" means All India Council for Technical Education established under the All India Council for Technical Education Act, 1987 (Central Act 52 of 1987);

(aa) 'Bar Council of India' means the Bar Council of India constituted under the Advocates Act, 1961 (Central Act 25 of 1961);*

(ab) 'campus' means that area of the university in which it is established;*

(b) "Council of Scientific and Industrial Research" means the Council of Scientific and Industrial Research, New Delhi, an agency of the Central Government;


(c) "Department of Science and Technology" means the Department of Science and Technology of the Central Government;

(d) Omitted*

(e) Omitted*

(f) 'employee' means a person appointed by the university and includes a teacher, officer and any other staff of the university;*

(fa) 'existing private university' means a university which has been established under the Haryana Private Universities Act, 2006 (32 of 2006)

(fb) 'faculty' means a group of academic departments of similar disciplines;";*

(g) "fee" means collection made by the university from the students by whatever name it may be called, which is not refundable;

(h) "Government" means the Government of the State of Haryana;

(i) "higher education" means study of a curriculum or course for the pursuit of knowledge beyond 10+2 level;

(j) 'hostel' means a place of residence of the students of the university;*

(k) "Indian Council of Agriculture Research" means the Indian Council of Agriculture Research, a society registered under the Societies Registration Act, 1860 (Central Act 21 of 1860);

(ka) 'Indian Nursing Council' means an autonomous body constituted under section 3 of the Indian Nursing Council Act, 1947 (48 of 1947);*

(l) "Medical Council of India" means Medical Council of India, Delhi;

(m) 'National Assessment and Accreditation Council' means National Assessment and Accreditation Council, Bangalore, an autonomous institution of the University Grants Commission;*

(ma) 'National Board of Accreditation' means National Board of Accreditation, New Delhi, an autonomous body of All India Council for Technical Education;*

(n) "National Council for Teacher Education" means the "National Council for Teacher Education, Delhi;";*

(o) and (p) omitted.*

"(q) 'Pharmacy Council of India' means Pharmacy Council of India, Delhi;";*

(r) "prescribed" means prescribed by rules made under this Act;

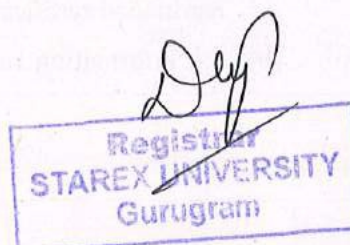
"(s) 'regulating body' means a body established by the Government of India for laying down norms and conditions for ensuring academic standards of higher education, such as University Grants Commission, All India Council for Technical Education, National

Council for Teacher Education, Medical Council of India, Bar Council of India, Pharmacy Council of India, National Assessment and Accreditation Council, Indian Council of Agriculture Research, **National Board of Accreditation**, Indian Nursing Council, Council of Scientific and Industrial Research etc. and includes the Government or any such body constituted by Government of India or the Government;";*

- "(t) 'Rules' means the rules made by the Government under this Act;";
- (u) "Schedule" means Schedule appended to this Act;
- (v) "sponsoring body" in relation to a university means-
- (i) a society registered under the Societies Registration Act, 1860 (Central Act 21 of 1860) ; or
- (ii) any public trust; or
- (iii) a company registered under section 25 of the Companies Act, 1956(Central Act 1 of 1956);
- (w) "Statutes", "Ordinances" and "Regulations" mean respectively, the Statutes, Ordinances and Regulations of the university made under this Act;
- (x) "student of the university" means a person enrolled in the university for taking a course of study for a degree, diploma or other academic distinction duly instituted by the university, including a research degree;
- (y) omitted;*
- "(z) 'teacher' means a Professor, Associate Professor, Assistant Professor or any other person required to impart education or guide research or render guidance in any other form to the students for pursuing a course or programme of study of the university;";*"
- (za) "university" means a university incorporated by law in India; and
- (zb) "University Grants Commission" means the University Grants Commission, established under the University Grants Commission Act, 1956 (Central Act 3 of 1956).

Objects of university. 3. Following shall be the objects of the university, namely: -

- (1) to provide instructions, teaching and training in higher education and make provisions for research, advancement and dissemination of knowledge;
- (2) to create higher levels of intellectual abilities;
- (3) to establish state of the art facilities for education and training;



- (4) to carry out teaching and research and offer continuing education programmes;
- (5) to create centres of excellence for research and development and for sharing knowledge and its application;
- (6) to establish a campus;,*
- (7) omitted;*
- (8) to institute degrees, diplomas, certificates and other academic distinctions on the basis of examination, or any such other method;
- “(9) to maintain the academic standard of degrees, diplomas, certificates and other academic distinctions as per bye-laws and to ensure that the same are not lower than those laid down by the regulating body;”*

Clauses (10), (11) and (12) have been omitted*

- (13) to pursue any other objective as may be approved by the Government.

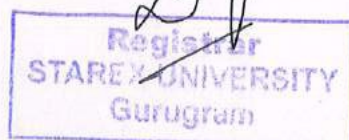
- 4. (1) An application containing the proposal and the project report to establish a university by a private sector shall be made by the sponsoring body to the Government, along with such fee, as may be prescribed. At the time of submission of application the sponsoring body shall fulfill the condition regarding possession of land as per provision laid down in section 9.#

Provided that the university excluding existing private university shall offer minimum three faculties at its commencement and shall provide instructions upto the level of Ph.D. in a period of three years in any of the three faculties in which it is imparting degree i.e. Humanities, Languages, Medicines, Commerce, Science, Engineering, Information Technology, Law, Agriculture and Allied Sciences, Management (Business, Hotel, Hospitality, Tourism etc.), Bio-Tech, Media and Mass Communication etc. with due permission from the relevant regulating bodies:*

Provided further that if a sponsoring body intends to set up Health and Medical Sciences University, it shall not be mandatory to offer minimum three faculties.*

- (2) The project report shall contain the following particulars, namely: -

- (a) the details of the sponsoring body along with the copies of its registration certificate, constitution and bye-laws;
- (b) the information regarding financial resources of the sponsoring



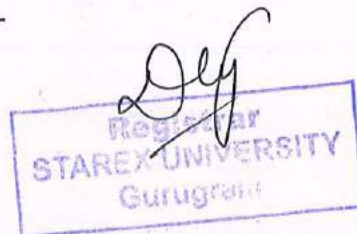
ships and scholarships to the poor students from economically poor or socially backward families including Scheduled Castes, Other Backward Classes and handicapped students;

- (p) the system proposed to be followed for selection of students for admission to the courses of study at the university;
- (q) the system proposed to be followed for appointment of teachers and other employees in the university;
- (r) omitted;*
- (s) whether the university proposes to undertake some programmes related to local needs. If so, the nature of specialized teaching, training or research activities to be undertaken by the university so as to fulfil this objective;
- (t) whether the university proposes to start some programmes for the benefit of farmers, women and industries . If so, details thereof may be given;
- (u) details of play grounds and other facilities available or proposed to be created for games and sports and extra-curricular activities like National Cadet Corps, National Service Scheme, Scouts and Guides etc;
- (v) the arrangements proposed to be made for academic auditing;
- (w) justification regarding the necessity of establishment of the proposed university;
- (x) commitment to follow the norms of the regulating bodies;
- (y) such other details as the sponsoring body may like to give; and
- (z) such other details as may be prescribed.

(3) The Government, on receipt of the proposal and the project report for establishment of a university, shall constitute a committee consisting of such members as may be specified by it, out of whom at least one shall be an expert, to examine the proposal and the project report.


Explanation. - In this sub-section the expression "expert" means an academician of prominence in the respective field of higher education.

(4) The committee shall consider the proposal and the project report on the following grounds, namely: -

- (c) the name, location and headquarters of the proposed university;
- (d) the objectives of the university;
- (e) the availability of land and details of buildings and infrastructure facilities, if already existing;
- (f) availability of academic facilities including teaching and non teaching staff, if any, at the disposal of sponsoring body;
- (g) the details of plans for campus development such as construction of buildings, development of structural amenities and infrastructure facilities and procurement of equipment etc. to be undertaken before the university starts functioning and phased programme for first five years;
- (h) the phased outlays of capital expenditure proposed for the next five years and its sources of finance;
- (i) the nature and the type of programmes of study and research proposed to be undertaken by the university and their relevance to the development goals and employment needs of the State and phasing of such programmes over the first five years with course-wise enrolment targets;
- (j) the experience and expertise in the concerned disciplines at the command of the sponsoring body;
- (k) the nature of facilities, courses of study and research proposed to be started;
- (l) the estimated recurring expenditure, course- wise or activity-wise, sources of finance and estimated expenditure per student;
- (m) the scheme for mobilizing resources and the cost of capital thereto and the manner of repayment to such sources;
- (n) the scheme for the generation of funds internally through the recovery of fee from students, revenues anticipated from consultancy services and other activities relating to the objects of the university and other anticipated incomes;
- (o) the proposed fee structure with reference to the details of expenditure on unit cost and the extent of concessions or rebates in fee or free-

evaluation system and the eligibility criteria for admission of students to the committee headed by Financial Commissioner and Principal Secretary to Government, Haryana, Education Department, Chandigarh in which Director, Higher Education, Haryana, Dean, Academic Affairs, Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra and Dean, Academic Affairs, Maharshi Dayanand University, Rohtak shall be the members. On detailed examination of the information made available the committee shall inform the sponsoring body about any short comings in respect of conformity to relevant regulations for rectification. The university shall offer the programme only after necessary rectification and approval from the committee;

- (iv) purchase books and journals of at least ten lac rupees or as per the norms of regulating bodies, whichever is higher, and give an undertaking to invest, within the first three years, not less than fifty lac rupees or as per the norms of regulating bodies, whichever is higher, on books, journals, computers, library networking and other facilities so as to make the library facilities adequate for contemporary teaching and research;
- (v) purchase equipments, computers, furniture, other moveable and immoveable assets and infrastructure facilities (other than buildings, referred to in clause (ii) above) worth twenty lac rupees or as per the norms of regulating bodies, whichever is higher, and give an undertaking to procure within the first five years equipments, computers, furniture, other moveable and immoveable assets and infrastructure facilities (other than buildings, referred to in clause (ii) above) worth not less than one crore rupees or as per the norms of regulating bodies, whichever is higher;
- (vi) give undertaking to appoint at least one Professor, two Associate Professors and adequate number of Assistant Professors alongwith necessary supporting staff in each department or discipline to be started by the university;*
- (vi-a) maintain objectivity, fairness and transparency in the recruitment of teachers of the proposed university with qualification not less than

- (a) financial soundness and assets of the sponsoring body and its ability to set up the infrastructure of the proposed university, manner of generation of funds to be raised by the proposed university before its operations. The sponsoring body shall give the detailed information in this regard as per the format given in the bye-laws framed under this Act at the time of application;*
- (b) back ground of the sponsoring body, that is to say, its expertise and experience in the field of education, its general reputation etc. and its commitment to follow the norms of the regulating bodies;
- (c) potentiality of the courses proposed to be offered, that is to say whether the courses are able to develop the human resources as per the requirements of contemporary demands, and whether the courses have new features and include emerging branches of learning.

(5) The committee, while considering the proposal and the project report under sub- section (4), may call for such other information from the sponsoring body as it thinks proper for the purpose.

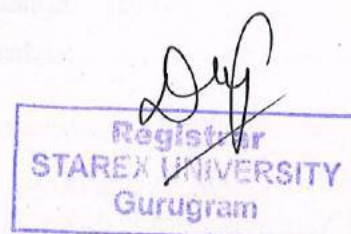
(6) The committee shall submit its report to the Government within a period of six months from the date of its constitution:

Provided that while computing the period of six months, the period commencing from the date on which requisition for any information under sub-section (5) is issued and ending on the date on which requisite information is submitted to the committee shall be excluded.*

Issuance of letter of intent and compliance report.

5. (1) After the receipt of the report of the committee constituted under sub-section (3) of section 4, if the Government is satisfied that it is advisable to establish the university, it may issue a letter of intent and ask the sponsoring body to-

- (i) establish an endowment fund in accordance with the provisions of section 11 ;
- (ii) construct a minimum of 10,000 square meters of covered area for administrative and academic purposes;
- (iii) provide all the relevant information relating to the first degree and post-graduate degree/diploma programme including the curriculum structure, contents, teaching and learning process, examination and

sub-section (2), its proposal submitted under section 4 shall stand rejected and the letter of intent issued under sub-section (1) of section 5 shall be deemed to have been withdrawn.

Incorporation of university.

6. The Government, if satisfied, after considering the report submitted under sub-section (2) of section 5 that the sponsoring body has complied with the provisions of sub-section (1) of section 5, may, by an Act of the State Legislature, establish a private university with such name, location, jurisdiction and with such infrastructure as may be specified in the Schedule.

7. Every university established by an Act of the State Legislature under section 6, shall be a body corporate by the name, as specified in the Act, and shall have perpetual succession and a common seal. It shall have the power to acquire and hold property both moveable and immoveable and to make contract, and shall sue, and be sued by the said name.

University to be self-financed.

8. The university shall be self-financed and shall not be entitled to receive any grant or other financial assistance from the Government or any Board or Corporation owned or controlled by the Government.

Requirement of land.

9. No university shall be established unless the sponsoring body is in possession of -

- (i) a minimum of twenty acres of land outside the municipal limits ; or
- (ii) a minimum of ten acres of land within the municipal limits.

Explanation: For the purposes of this section, "possession" means possession either by way of ownership or as a lessee having perpetual lease for a minimum period of thirty years.#

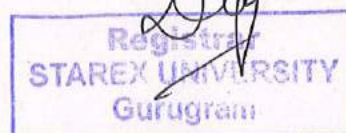
No power to affiliate any college or institution.

"(10) **Bar to affiliation and opening off shore campus etc.**-(1) The university shall not admit any college or institution to the privilege of affiliation.
(2) It shall not open any off campus, off shore campus, study centre and examination centre in or out of the State of Haryana and shall not offer any programme through distance education mode.".*

Endowment fund.

11. "(1) The sponsoring body shall establish an endowment fund for the university with a minimum amount of five crores rupees which shall be pledged in the form of Fixed Deposit Receipt in original in favour of the Higher Education Commissioner, Haryana, Panchkula.*

Note: The provisions of sub-section (1) shall not be applicable to the



those prescribed by the University Grants Commission or other regulating bodies;*

- (vii) give undertaking to take up co-curricular activities like seminars, debates, quiz programmes and extra-curricular activities like games, sports, National Service Scheme, National Cadet Corps etc. for the benefit of students as per the norms laid down by the regulating bodies;
- (viii) give undertaking for establishment of provident fund and to take up welfare programmes for the employees of the university; and
- (ix) fulfill such other conditions and provide such other information as may be prescribed by University Grants Commission, All India Council for Technical Education or any other statutory body established by Central or State Government;
- (x) provide its commitment to prevent all types of ragging in the campus in accordance with the regulations prescribed by the University Grants Commission, Government norms and statutory provisions in this regard, if any.*

(2) The sponsoring body shall fulfill the requirements and conditions specified in sub-section (1) and shall report the compliance to the Government within a period of one year from the date of issue of the letter of intent. On receiving the compliance report, the Government shall appoint a committee consisting of such members, including the representative of the regulating bodies, as may be specified, to verify the compliance report. The committee shall submit its report to the Government within a period of one month from the date of its constitution specifying whether the sponsoring body has fulfilled the requirements and conditions as laid down in sub-section (1).

Provided that Government may further extend the term for a maximum period of one year not exceeding six months at a time if it is satisfied that the sponsoring body has taken substantial steps towards setting up of the University.#

- (3) If the sponsoring body has failed to comply with the provisions of

- (c) for the payment of the cost of audit of the funds established under sections 11 and 12;
- (d) for meeting the expenses of any suit or proceedings to which the university is a party;
- (e) for the payment of salaries and allowances of the officers and employees of the university and members of the teaching and research staff, and for payment of any provident fund contributions, gratuity and other benefits to any such officers and employees, and members of the teaching and research staff;
- (f) for the payment of travelling and other allowances of the members of the Governing Body, the Board of Management, the Academic Council and other authorities so declared under the Statutes of the university and of the members of any committee appointed by any of the authorities or by the Chairperson of the sponsoring body or the Vice-Chancellor, as the case may be, of the university in pursuance of any provision of this Act, Statutes, Ordinances, Regulations or Rules;
- (g) for the payment of fellowships, freeships, scholarships, assistantships and other awards to students belonging to economically weaker sections of the society or research associates or trainees, as the case may be, or to any student otherwise eligible for such awards under the Statutes, Ordinances, Regulations or Rules;
- (h) for the payment of any expenses incurred by the university in carrying out the provisions of this Act, Statutes, Ordinances, Regulations or Rules;
- (i) for the payment of cost of capital, not exceeding the prevailing bank rate of interest, incurred by the sponsoring body for setting up the university and the investments made therefor;
- (j) for the payment of charges and expenditure relating to the consultancy work undertaken by the university in pursuance of the provisions of this Act, Statutes, Ordinances, Regulations or Rules; and
- (k) for the payment of any other expenses including service fee payable

existing private university.*

(2) The endowment fund shall be used as a security deposit to ensure that the university complies with the provisions of this Act, Statutes, Ordinances, Rules and Bye-laws. The Government shall have the power to forfeit the whole or part of fund in case the university or the sponsoring body contravenes any of the provisions of this Act, Statutes, Ordinances, bye-laws or Rules or use it for meeting the expenditure for academic and administrative purposes in case of dissolution in accordance with bye-laws."

(3) Income from endowment fund may be utilized for the development of infrastructure of the university but shall not be utilized to meet out the recurring expenditure of the university.

(4) The amount of endowment fund shall be invested and kept invested until the dissolution of the university, in long term securities issued or guaranteed by the Government or deposited and kept deposited in an interest bearing personal deposit account in Government treasury.

(5) In case of investment in a long term security, the certificates of the security shall be kept in the safe custody of the Government and in case of deposit in the interest bearing personal deposit account in the Government treasury, the deposit shall be made with the condition that the amount shall not be withdrawn without the prior permission of the Government.

General fund.

12. Every university shall establish a fund, which shall be called the general fund to which the following shall be credited, namely:-

- (a) fees and other charges received by the university;
- (b) any contributions made by the sponsoring body;
- (c) any income received from consultancy and other work undertaken by the university in pursuance of its objectives;
- (d) trusts, bequests, donations, endowments and any other grants; and
- (e) all other sums received by the university.

Application of general fund.

13. The general fund shall be utilized for the following objects, namely:-

- (a) for the repayment of debts including interest charges thereto incurred by the university for the purposes of this Act, the Statutes, Ordinances, Regulations and Rules;
- (b) for upkeep of the assets of the university;

Appointment,

16. (1) The Chancellor shall be appointed by the sponsoring body for a period of three years with the approval of the Visitor by following such procedure and on such terms and conditions as may be prescribed.

(2) The Chancellor shall be the head of the university.

(3) The Chancellor shall preside over the meetings of the Governing Body and shall, when the Visitor is not present, preside over the convocation of the university for conferring degrees, diplomas or other academic distinctions.

(4) The Chancellor shall have the following powers, namely:-

(a) to call for any information or record;

(b) to appoint the Vice-Chancellor;

(c) to remove the Vice-Chancellor in accordance with the provisions of sub-section (7) of section 17; and

(d) such other powers as may be specified by the Statutes.

Appointment,

17. "(1) The Vice-Chancellor shall be appointed by the Chancellor as per the qualifications prescribed by the University Grants Commission, subject to the provisions contained in sub-section (7) and shall hold office for a term of three years:*

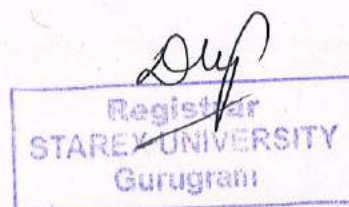
Provided that after expiry of the term of three years, the Vice-Chancellor shall be eligible for re-appointment for another term of three years:

Provided further that a Vice-Chancellor shall continue to hold the office even after the expiry of his term till new Vice-Chancellor joins. However, in any case the period shall not exceed one year."

(2) The Vice-Chancellor shall be the principal executive and academic officer of the university and shall exercise general superintendence and control over the affairs of the university and shall execute the decisions of various authorities of the university.

(3) In the absence of both the Visitor and the Chancellor, the Vice-Chancellor shall preside over the convocation of the university.

(4) If, in the opinion of the Vice-Chancellor, it is necessary to take immediate action on any matter for which powers are conferred on any other authority by or under this Act, he may take such action as he may deem necessary and shall at the earliest opportunity thereafter report his action to such officer or authority as would have in the ordinary course dealt with the matter:



to any organization charged with the responsibility of providing any specific service, including the managerial services to the university, on behalf of the sponsoring body, as approved by the Board of Management to be an expense for the purposes of the university:

Provided that no expenditure shall be incurred by the university in excess of the limits for total recurring expenditure and total non-recurring expenditure for the year, as may be fixed by the Board of Management, without the prior approval of the Board of Management:

Provided further that the general fund shall, for the objects specified under clause (a), be applied with the prior approval of the Governing Body of the university.

Officers.

14. The following shall be the officers of the university, namely:-


- (1) the Visitor;
- (2) the Chancellor;
- (3) the Vice-Chancellor;
- (4) the Registrar;
- (4A) the Controller of Examinations;*
- (5) the Chief Finance and Accounts Officer;
- (6) such other officers as may be declared by the Statutes to be the officers of the university.

Powers of Visitor.

15. (1) The Governor of Haryana shall be the Visitor of the university.

(2) The Visitor shall have the following powers, namely:-

- (a) when present, he shall preside over the convocation of the university for conferring degrees and diplomas ;
- (b) to call for any paper or information relating to the affairs of the university; and
- (c) on the basis of the information received under clause (b), if he is satisfied that any order, proceeding, or decision taken by any authority of the university is not in conformity with the provisions of this Act, Statutes, Ordinances, Regulations or Rules, he may issue such directions as he may deem fit in the interest of the university and the directions so issued shall be complied with by the university.

(4) The Registrar shall exercise such other powers and perform such other duties as may be specified by the Statutes.

"18A. - (1) The Controller of Examination shall be whole time salaried officer of the university and shall be appointed by the Chancellor in accordance with the Statutes.

(2) It shall be the duty of the Controller of Examinations,-

(2) The manner of appointment of other officers of the university and their powers and functions shall be such as may be specified by the Statutes.

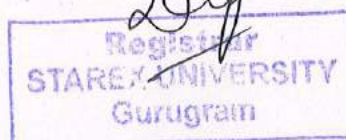

22. (1) The Governing Body of the university shall consist of the following



Provided that if in the opinion of the concerned officer or authority such action should not have been taken by the Vice-Chancellor then such case shall be referred to the Chancellor, whose decision thereon shall be final:

Provided further that where any such action taken by the Vice-Chancellor affects any person in the service of the university, such person shall be entitled to prefer, within three months from the date on which such action is communicated to him, an appeal to the Board of Management and the Board of Management may confirm or modify or reverse the action taken by the Vice-Chancellor.

(5) If, in the opinion of the Vice-Chancellor, any decision of any authority of the university is beyond the scope of the powers conferred by this Act, Statutes, Ordinances, Regulations or Rules or is likely to be prejudicial to the interests of the university, he shall direct the concerned authority to revise its decision within fifteen days from the date of such direction and in case the authority refuses to revise such decision wholly or partly or fails to take any decision within fifteen days, then such matter shall be referred to the Chancellor and his decision thereon shall be final.

(6) The Vice-Chancellor shall exercise such powers and perform such duties as may be specified by the Statutes or the Ordinances.

(7) If, at any time upon representation made or otherwise and after making such inquiry as may be deemed necessary, the situation so warrants and if the continuance of the Vice-Chancellor is not in the interests of the university, the Chancellor may, by an order in writing stating the reasons therein, ask the Vice-Chancellor to relinquish his office from such date as may be specified in the order:



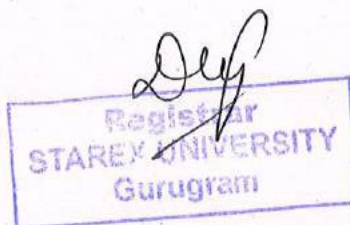

23. (1) The Board of Management shall consist of the following members, namely :-
- (a) the Vice-Chancellor ;

 - (c) two members of the Governing Body, nominated by the sponsoring body;
 - (d) three persons, who are not the members of the Governing Body, nominated by the sponsoring body;

- (2) The Vice-Chancellor shall be the Chairperson of the Board of Management.

24. (1) The Academic Council shall consist of the Vice-Chancellor and such other members as may be specified by the Statutes.

- (3) The Academic Council shall be the principal academic body of the university and shall, subject to the provisions of this Act, Statutes, Ordinances, Regulations or Rules, co-ordinate and exercise general supervision over the academic policies of the university.



- (b) to review the decisions of other authorities of the university in case they are not in conformity with the provisions of this Act, Statutes, Ordinances, Regulations or Rules;
- (c) to approve the budget and annual report of the university;
- (d) to lay down the extensive policies to be followed by the university;
- (e) to recommend to the sponsoring body for the dissolution of the university if a situation arises when there is no smooth functioning of the university in spite of best efforts; and
- (f) such other powers as may be specified by the Statutes :

Provided that the Secretary to Government, Haryana, Education Department or in his absence, Director, Higher Education shall be present in each meeting in which decisions on issues involving Government policies/ instructions are to be taken.

(3) The Governing Body shall meet at least three times in a calendar year.

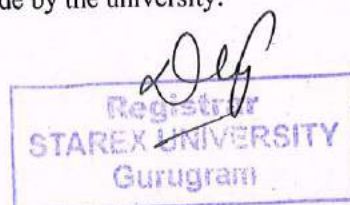

 - (k) provisions regarding number of seats in different courses.

(2) The Governing Body shall prepare First Statute of the university and submit the same to the Government for its approval within a period of one month after incorporation of the university in the Schedule of the Act.*

(3) The Government shall consider the First Statute submitted by the university and if any modifications are deemed necessary, the same shall be conveyed to the university for sending the amended draft and if the amended draft is found in order, it shall give approval within a period of three months from the date of its receipt.*

(4) The university shall communicate its agreement to the First Statute as approved by the Government, and if it desires not to give effect to any or all of the modifications made by the Government under sub-section (3), it may give reasons thereof and after considering such reasons, the Government may or may not accept the suggestions made by the university.

(4) The quorum for meetings of the Academic Council shall be such as may be specified by the Statutes.

25. The composition, constitution, powers and functions of other authorities of the university shall be such as may be specified by the Statutes.

26. A person shall be disqualified for being a member of any of the authorities or bodies of the university, if he-

- (a) is of unsound mind and stands so declared by a competent court;
- (b) is an undischarged insolvent;
- (c) has been convicted of any offence involving moral turpitude;
- (d) is conducting or engaging himself in private coaching classes; or
- (e) has been punished for indulging in or promoting unfair practice in the conduct of any examination, in any form, anywhere.

27. No act or proceeding of any authority or body of the university shall be invalid merely by reason of any vacancy or defect in the constitution thereof.

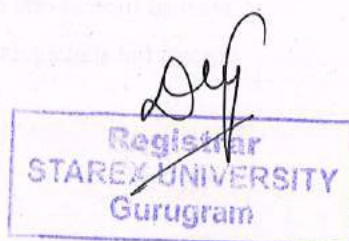
28. Any vacancy which may occur in the membership of the authorities or bodies of the university due to death, resignation or removal of a member or due to change of capacity in which he was appointed or nominated, shall be filled up as early as possible by the person or the body who had appointed or nominated such a member:

Provided that the person appointed or nominated as a member of an authority or body of the university on an emergent vacancy, shall remain a member of such authority or body only for the unexpired tenure of the member, in whose place he is appointed or nominated.

29. The authorities or officers of the university may constitute such committees with such terms of reference as may be necessary for specific tasks to be performed by such committees. The constitution of such committees and their duties shall be such as may be specified by the Statutes.

30. (1) Subject to the provisions of this Act and the Rules, the First Statute of the university may provide for all or any of the following matters, namely:-

- (a) the constitution, powers and functions of the authorities and other bodies of the university, as may be constituted from



enrolment as such;

- (b) the courses of study to be laid down for the degrees, diplomas and certificates of the university;
- (c) the award of the degrees, diplomas, certificates and other academic distinctions, the minimum qualifications for the same and the means to be taken relating to the granting and obtaining of the same;
- (d) the conditions for award of fellowships, scholarships, stipends, medals and prizes;
- (e) the conduct of examinations, including the term of office and manner of appointment and the duties of examining bodies, examiners and moderators;
- (f) fees to be charged for the various courses, examinations, degrees and diplomas of the university;
- (g) the conditions of residence of the students of the university;
- (h) provisions regarding disciplinary action against the students;
- (i) the creation, composition and functions of any other body which is considered necessary for improving the academic life of the university;
- (j) the manner of co-operation and collaboration with other universities and institutions of higher education;
- (k) all other matters which by this Act or Statutes are required to be provided for by the Ordinances.

(2) The First Ordinance of the university shall be made by the Vice-Chancellor which after being approved by the Board of Management, shall be submitted to the Government for its approval.

(3) The Government shall consider the First Ordinance submitted by the Vice-Chancellor under sub-section (2) within a period of three months from the date of its receipt and shall either approve it or give suggestions for modifications therein.*

(4) The Vice-Chancellor shall either modify the Ordinance incorporating the suggestions of the Government or give reasons for not incorporating any of the suggestions made by the Government and shall return the

(5) The Government shall publish the First Statute, as finally approved by it, in the Official Gazette.

Subsequent Statutes.

31. (1) Subject to the provisions of this Act and the Rules, the subsequent Statutes of the university may provide for all or any of the following matters, namely:-

- (a) creation of new authorities of the university;
- (b) accounting policy and financial procedure;
- (c) representation of teachers in the authorities of the university;
- (d) creation of new departments and abolition or restructuring of an existing department;
- (e) institution of medals and prizes;
- (f) creation of posts and procedure for abolition of posts;
- (g) revision of fees;
- (h) alteration of the number of seats in different syllabi; and
- (i) all other matters which under the provisions of this Act are to be specified by the Statutes.

(2) The Statutes of the university other than the First Statute, shall be made by the Board of Management with the approval of the Governing Body.

(3) The Statutes made under sub-section (2) shall be sent to the Government and the Government may approve them as such or, if it considers necessary, give suggestions for modifications in them within three months from the date of receipt of the Statutes.*

(4) The Governing Body shall consider the modifications as suggested and return the Statutes to the Government with changes made therein or with its comments on the suggestions made by the Government.

(5) The Government shall consider the changes or the comments of the Governing Body and shall approve the Statutes with or without modifications and then the Statutes as finally approved by the Government shall be published by Government in the Official Gazette.

First Ordinance.

32. (1) Subject to the provisions of this Act, the Statutes, the Regulations or the Rules, the First Ordinance may provide for all or any of the following matters, namely:-

- (a) the admission of students to the university and their

34B. **Power to cancel a course.-** The Government may if it is satisfied that the university is not in a position to efficiently discharge the duties and obligations imposed, it may, after making such inquiry, as may be specified by bye-laws, cancel the permission to continue the course or programme of study.*

34C. **Compulsory disclosure of information.-** (1) Every university established under this Act shall publish before expiry of sixty days prior to the date of the commencement of admission to any of its courses or programme of study, a prospectus containing the following information, namely:—

- (a) each component of the fee, deposits and other charges payable by the students for pursuing a course or programme of study, and the other terms and conditions of such payment;
- (b) the percentage of tuition fee and other charges refundable to a student in case such student withdraws from university before or after completion of course or programme of study and the time within, and the manner, in which such refund shall be made;
- (c) the number of seats approved by the statutory authority in respect of each course or programme of study for the academic year for which admission is proposed to be made;
- (d) the conditions of eligibility for admission in a particular course or programme of study;
- (e) the educational qualifications specified by the university where no such qualifying standards have been specified by any regulating body;
- (f) the process of admission and selection of candidates, including all relevant information with regard to the details of test or examination for selecting such candidates for admission to each course or programme of study and the amount of fee to be paid for the admission test;
- (g) details of the teaching faculty, including therein the educational qualifications, teaching experience and indicating therein

First Ordinance along with such reasons, if any, to the Government and on receipt of the same, the Government shall consider the comments of the Vice-Chancellor and shall approve the First Ordinance of the university with or without such modifications, and then the First Ordinance, as approved by the Government shall be published by the Government in the Official Gazette.

33. (1) All Ordinances other than the First Ordinance shall be made by the Academic Council which after being approved by the Board of Management shall be submitted to the Government for its approval.

(2) The Government shall consider the Ordinances submitted by the Academic Council under sub-section (1) within a period of three months from the date of their receipt and shall approve them or give suggestions for modifications therein.*

(3) The Academic Council shall either modify the Ordinances incorporating the suggestions of the Government or give reasons for not incorporating any of the suggestions made by the Government and shall return the Ordinances along with such reasons, if any, to the Government and on receipt of the same, the Government shall consider the comments of the Academic Council and shall approve the Ordinances with or without modifications and then the Ordinances, as approved by the Government, shall be published by the Government in the Official Gazette.

Regulations

34. The authorities of the university may, subject to the prior approval of the Board of Management, make regulations, consistent with this Act, Statutes, Ordinances and Rules for the conduct of their business and that of the committees appointed by them.

34A. - (1) The university intending to start a new course or programme of study, shall intimate such intention to the Government, along- with an assessment report as prescribed under the bye-laws.

Authorisation to

(2) The Government shall specify the manner in which the university shall commence enrolment of students for such course or programme of study and shall give authorization to the university to start the course or programme of study and also approve the procedure thereof.

(3) The university shall not commence first enrolment of students without specific authorization of the Government. In no case, the application for authorization be kept pending beyond 120 days, whereafter it shall be deemed to



the basis of marks or grade obtained in the qualifying examination and achievements in co-curricular and extra-curricular activities or on the basis of marks or grade obtained in the entrance test conducted at the state level either by an association of the universities conducting similar courses or by any agency of the State:

Provided that admission in professional and technical courses shall be made only through an entrance test.

(3) A minimum of 25% seats for admissions in the university shall be reserved for students of the State of Haryana, out of which 10% seats shall be reserved for students belonging to Scheduled Castes of the State of Haryana.

Provided that in case of the universities having collaboration with reputed foreign or international universities or other institutions of other similar nature, the Government may relax the percentage of this reservation.~

Explanation: 'collaboration with reputed foreign or international universities' means and includes an agreement for collaboration in the areas like course structure, curriculum and faculty development, joint research programmes, student exchange programmes and admission through internationally or nationally recognized processes.~

Fee structure.

36. Fee structure. - (1) The university may, from time to time, prepare fee structure and shall send it for information to the Government, at least thirty days before the commencement of the academic session.

(2) The fee structure for the twenty-five per cent of the students who are domicile of Haryana shall be based on merit-cum-means and be as follows:-

- (i) one-fifth of the twenty-five per cent shall be granted full fee concession;
- (ii) two-fifth of the twenty-five per cent shall be granted fifty per cent fee concession;
- (iii) the balance two-fifth of the twenty-five per cent shall be granted twenty-five per cent fee concession.*

Provided that in case of the universities having collaboration with reputed foreign or international universities or other institutions of other similar nature, the Government may approve different percentage of students eligible for 100%, 50% or 25% fee

whether such member is a regular faculty member or is a visiting member;

- (h) information with regard to physical and academic infrastructure and other facilities including hostel accommodation, library and hospital or industry wherein the practical training to be imparted to the students and in particular the facilities accessible by students on being admitted to the university;
- (i) broad outlines of the syllabus specified by the appropriate statutory authority or by the university, as the case may be, for every course or programme of study, including the teaching hours, practical sessions and other assignments;
- (j) all relevant instructions with regard to maintenance of discipline by students within or outside the campus, prohibition of ragging and consequences thereof for violating the provisions of any regulations in this regard made under the University Grants Commission Act, 1956 (Central Act 3 of 1956) or any other law for the time being in force.
- (k) any such other information which may be prescribed:

Provided that the university shall publish information referred to under this section on its website, and the attention of prospective students and the general public shall be drawn to such publication on the website through advertisements displayed prominently in the different newspapers and through other media.

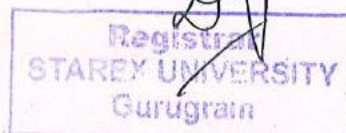
(2) Every university shall fix the price of each printed copy of the prospectus, not more than the reasonable cost of its publication, distribution or sale and its copy shall be sent to the Government for information. ".*

Admissions.

35. (1) Admission in the university shall be made strictly on the basis of merit:

Provided that for the purpose of filling minority quota in the university established and administered by a minority community, the zone of consideration for determination of merit shall be limited only to the students belonging to that minority community.

(2) Merit for admission in the university may be determined either on

years of its establishment and inform the Government and such other regulatory bodies which are connected with the courses taken up by the university about the grade provided by the said accrediting bodies to the university. The university shall get renewed such accreditation at an interval of every five years thereafter or as per norms of the concerned accrediting bodies.*

41. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act, the university shall be bound to comply with all the rules, regulations, norms etc. of the regulating bodies and provide all such facilities and assistance to such bodies as are required by them to discharge their duties and carry out their functions.

42. (1) The annual report of the university shall be prepared by the Board of Management which shall include among other matters, the steps taken by the university towards the fulfilment of its objects and shall be approved by the Governing Body and a copy of the same shall be submitted to the sponsoring body.

(2) Copies of the annual report prepared under sub-section (1) shall also be presented to the Visitor and the Government.

43. (1) The annual accounts including balance sheet of the university shall be prepared under the directions of the Board of Management and the annual accounts shall be audited at least once in every year by the auditors appointed by the university for this purpose.

(2) A copy of the annual accounts together with the audit report shall be submitted to the Governing Body.

(3) A copy of the annual accounts and audit report along with the observations of the Governing Body shall be submitted to the sponsoring body.

(4) Copies of annual accounts and balance sheet prepared under sub-section (1) shall also be presented to the Visitor and the Government. The advice of the Government or the Visitor, if any, arising out of the accounts and audit report of the university shall be placed before the Governing Body. The Governing Body shall issue such directions, as it may deem fit, and compliance shall be reported to the Visitor or the Government, as the case may be.

44. (1) The Government may cause an assessment to be made, in such manner, as may be prescribed, for the purpose of ascertaining the standards of teaching, examination and research or any other matter relating to the university.*

(2) The Government for ascertaining and ensuring quality at different levels of higher education in a university and for its continued sustenance shall conduct

(3) The university shall not charge any fee, by what ever name called, other than that prescribed as per sub-sections (1) and (2) above.

Examinations.

37. At the beginning of each academic session and in any case not later than the 30th of August of every calendar year, the university shall prepare and publish a semester wise or annual, as the case may be, Schedule of examinations for each and every course conducted by it and shall strictly adhere to the Schedule.

Explanation.- "Schedule of Examination" means a table giving details about the time, day and date of the commencement of each paper which is a part of a scheme of examinations and shall also include the details about the practical examinations:

Provided that if, for any reason whatsoever, the university has been unable to follow the Schedule, it shall, as soon as may be practicable, submit a report to the Government incorporating the detailed reasons for making a departure from the published Schedule. The Government may, on considering the report shall issue such directions to the university as it may deem fit.

Declaration of results.

38. (1) The university shall strive to declare the results of every examination conducted by it within a period of thirty days from the last date of the examination for that particular course and shall in any case declare the results latest within a period of forty-five days from such date:

Provided that if, for any reason whatsoever, the university is unable to finally declare the results of any examination within the aforesaid period of forty-five days, it shall submit a report incorporating the detailed reasons for such delay to the Government. The Government may, on considering the report shall issue such directions to the university as it may deem fit.


(2) No examination or the results of an examination shall be held invalid only for the reasons that the university has not followed the Schedule as stipulated in section 37 or, as the case may be, in this section.

Convocation.

39. The convocation of the university shall be held in every academic year in the manner as may be specified by the Statutes for conferring degrees, diplomas or for any other purpose.

Accreditation of university.

40. The university shall obtain accreditation from the National Assessment and Accreditation Council, Bangalore or **National Board of Accreditation** within five

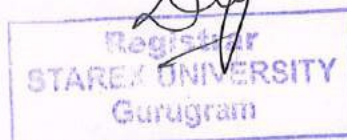
(3) The Government shall, for the purposes of any enquiry under sub-section (2), appoint an inquiry officer or officers to inquire into any of the allegations and to report thereon.

(4) The inquiry officer or officers appointed under sub-section (3) shall have the same powers as are vested in a civil court under the Code of Civil Procedure, 1908 (Act 5 of 1908), while trying a suit in respect of the following matters, namely:-

- (a) summoning and enforcing the attendance of any person and examining him on oath;
- (b) requiring the discovery and production of any such document or any other material as may be predicable in evidence;
- (c) requisitioning any public record from any court or office; and
- (d) any other matter which may be prescribed.

(5) The inquiry officer or officers inquiring under this Act shall be deemed to be a civil court for the purposes of section 195 and Chapter XXVI of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 (Act 2 of 1974).

(6) On receipt of the enquiry report from the officer or officers appointed under sub-section (3), if the Government is satisfied that the university has contravened all or any of the provisions of this Act, Statutes, Ordinances or Rules or has violated any of the directions issued by it under this Act or has ceased to carry out the requirements and conditions under sub-section (1) of section 5 or a



annual academic and administrative audit through Higher Education Department, Haryana or any other body or persons authorized by it, which shall scrutinize whether the university is complying with and functioning in accordance with the provisions of this Act, Statutes, Ordinances, Rules, bye-laws, instructions and the conditions of the Letter of Intent.*

(3) Such persons or body shall give their report within three months to the Government with specific recommendations and deficiencies, if found. (4) After considering the reply to the show cause notice, the Government shall have the power to impose penalty under the Act.*

44A. The following penalties may be imposed upon the university for maladministration, misinformation and for not maintaining standards, namely:-

- (i) stopping of admissions in one or more faculties;
- (ii) financial penalty of a minimum of ten lakhs and maximum of one crore;
- (iii) dissolution of the university in a phased manner;

Provided that no such penalty shall be imposed unless the university has been given a show cause notice.*

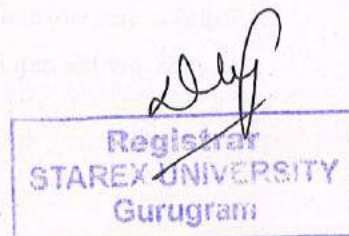

Power to make bye-laws

47A.- The Government may, by notification in the Official Gazette, make bye-laws for carrying out the purposes of this Act.*

Power to remove difficulties.

48. (1) If any difficulty arises in giving effect to the provisions of this Act, the Government may, by order published in the Official Gazette, make provisions, not inconsistent with the provisions of this Act, as appear to it to be necessary or expedient for removing the difficulty.

(2) Every order made under this section shall, as soon as may be after it is made, be laid before the House of the State Legislature.

49. The provisions of this Act and the Statutes, Ordinances, Regulations and the Rules shall have effect notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in

(7) The administrator appointed under sub-section (6) shall have all the powers and shall be subject to all the duties of the Governing Body and the Board of Management under this Act and shall administer the affairs of the university until the last batch of the students of the regular courses have completed their courses and have been awarded degrees, diplomas or awards, as the case may be.

Provided that the degrees, diplomas or awards granted under sub-section (8) shall not be invalid merely on the ground that the university has been dissolved.

Power to make rules. 47. (1) The Government may, by notification in the Official Gazette, make rules for carrying out the purposes of this Act.

(2) Without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing power, such rules may provide for all or any of the following matters, namely:-

- (a) the manner of making proposal to establish a university and the fee payable under sub-section (1) of section 4;
- (b) other particulars to be contained in the project report under sub-section (2) of section 4;
- (c) the manner of forfeiting the endowment fund in case of contravention of the provisions of this Act, Statutes, Ordinances, Regulations or Rules under sub-section (2) of section 11;

STATEMENT OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

There is a need for creation and expansion of educational institutions for improving opportunities of higher education for the youth of the State. In order to accommodate the unprecedented growth of students in higher education, and also to cross the target of 30% gross enrolment ratio (GER), we need to roughly double the number of institutions at all levels by 2020. The Government intervention would not be adequate to meet this benchmark in higher education. We need to enlist the participation of private sector in a major way. Haryana Private Universities Act, 2006 has been brought essentially to rope in private sector to supplement the initiative of Government in expanding the capacity in higher education and upscaling its standards.

The Private Universities established till date have shown promise to be emerged as Centres of Excellence in academic spheres. The private universities in the State do not receive any funding/grant/financial assistance from the State Government and it takes a considerable time for a Vice-Chancellor to familiarize with the regulatory, academic and research works of the university system. Therefore, for the steady progress and academic development, it is proposed that there should not be any cap/restriction on the number of terms of a Vice-Chancellor in a private university. The Vice-Chancellor shall be eligible for re-appointment for subsequent terms of three years each till he attains the age of 70 years, if the Vice-Chancellor has contributed significantly to raise the academic and research standards of the university.

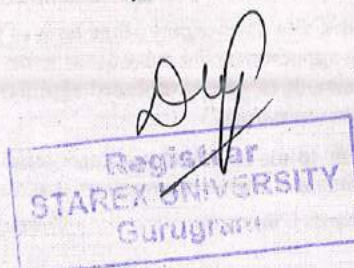

Sub: Recognition to Starex University, Gurgaon, Haryana and Fresh approval to its School of Law for imparting five year BA LL.B (Hons.) course and five year BBA LL.B (Hons.) course with intake of two sections of 60 students in each section in each course for a period of two years i.e. for the academic years 2018-2019 and 2019-2020.

Sir,

The Legal Education Committee of the Bar Council of India at its meeting held on 13th May, 2018 considered the inspection report of School of Law, Starex University, Gurgaon, Haryana submitted by the inspection team. After consideration, Committee is of the view that as per Section 7 (1) (i) of the Advocates Act, 1961 **Starex University, Gurgaon, Haryana** be granted recognition for the purpose of conferring the degrees of law for imparting five year BA LL.B(Hons.) course and five year BBA LL.B(Hons.) course from the academic year 2018-2019 and further fresh approval to its School of Law, Starex University, Gurgaon, Haryana for imparting **five year BA LL.B (Hons.) course and five year BBA LL.B (Hons.) course with intake of two sections of 60 students** in each section in each course for a period of **two years i.e. for the academic years 2018-2019 and 2019-2020.**

However, the Committee finds that for the two courses it has a total of five faculty members for law only which is short by one. The University should appoint atleast one more faculty member within a period of two months after proper selection with intimation to the Bar Council of India within the same period. Similarly, for five year BBA LL.B (Hons.) course they have only two faculty members for social science subjects. The University is directed to appoint one more faculty member for third social science subjects through proper selection within a period of two months with intimation to the Bar Council of India within the same period.

Since, the University is starting Honours courses, they have also to follow the rule in terms of honours degree which is quoted hereunder :-

Rule - 4, Schedule II

*(b) For specialized and / or honors course, a student has to take not less than thirty eight papers in all, which shall include twenty compulsory papers, four clinical papers, six optional papers and * eight papers in specialized/honors course in any Group as stipulated below. However if eight papers are taken from multiple of groups, *honors can be given in general law without mentioning any specialization.*

Example: "A" has taken eight honors papers selected as follows: two from Constitutional Law, three from Business Law, one from International Law and two from International Trade Law, his Honors shall be in Law. "B" takes eight papers from Constitutional Law group, his honors shall be mentioned in Constitutional Law."

The University/College is directed to also fulfill the following conditions, failure of which may lead to subsequent necessary and proper action being taken in this regard :-

1. Since there is lot of space available in the college building the library shall be shifted from the adjacent building to the law college building.
2. The Institution is directed to establish the Legal Aid Centre as per Clause-11, Schedule-III of Rule-11 of the Part-IV of the Legal Education Rules - 2008.
3. Institution should ensure the payment of salary to teachers as per Rules 22 schedule III, Part IV of BCI Rules.
4. The library should be furnished as per Clause 15 of Schedule III of Legal Education Rules 2008 given below :-

Minimum Library requirement: To start with, a Law Library shall have a set of AIR manual, Combo offer of CD of AIR Pvt. Ltd. (containing electronic version of AIR Supreme Court and High Court Data bases Research 1950-2015 (four connections each) Cr. L.J. Data Base 1950-2015(four connections) AIR Privy Council Data Base 1900-1950 (four connections) AIR Mannual latest 6th Edition(1-45 Vols.) AIR Journal 2015, Cr. L.J. 2015, L.I.C. 2015, AIR Civil Cases 2015, AIR Law Lines 2015, AIR Cheque Dishonour Reports 2015, AIR Accident Claims and compensation 2015, Institution shall get electronic versions updated every year by AIR Pvt. Ltd. Central Acts and Local Acts, Criminal law journal, SCC, Company cases, Indian Bar Review, selected Judgements on Professional Ethics and Journals with the back volumes for at least ten years and also such number of text books in each subjects taught during the period according to the minimum standard ratio of ten books for each registered students. For running integrated program, text books of such other subjects are also to be kept in the similar minimum ratio.

5. The institution should keep in mind that minimum 10 sets of Indian Bar Review, selected judgments and professional Ethics published by Bar Council of India Trust and the AIR volumes/set must be promptly ordered for the library if not already ordered, as it is an essential requirement to run a law college which is stipulated by Bar Council of India, Legal Education Rules 2008 framed under a Parliament Act.
6. The institution is directed to make a minimum investment as provided below for upgrading it's library as per the following guideline :-

"Today with the increasing cost of journals, books, wi-fi, e-library and online facilities including I.T. facilities, the minimum investment by each university should be Rs. 10

S.G.



lakhs for each year. However for any university/deemed university in rural area, the investment should be Rs. 5 Lakh and for all other affiliated colleges in the urban area it should be Rs. 2 lakhs and in rural area it should be Rs. 1 lakh."

7. Teacher Student ratio shall be as per Schedule-III, Rule-11, Clause-17, Part-IV of Bar Council of India Rules.
8. Institution is directed to inform the timings of the classes.
9. A Centre of Legal Education must ensure that not less than three percent seats are reserved for persons with disabilities.
10. Centre of Legal Education shall equip itself to provide appropriate facilities in terms of the physical infrastructure, academic infrastructure and any other facilities required for the effective participation of disabled students, teachers and staff in their respective activities. For e.g. (a) ramps in public buildings and (b) Braille symbols and auditory signals in elevators or lifts.

The same shall be verified during the next inspection.

Further,
the University/College must specify the timing of the college which has not been given. College should also maintain the timing which has to be minimum 5 ½ hours with half an hour break. College is directed to file an affidavit to the Bar Council of India within six weeks mentioning the timing of the classes. The relevant rules are quoted hereunder :-

Rule (xxiii), Chapter I

"(xxiii) "Regular Course of Study" means and includes a course which runs for at least five hours a day continuously with an additional half an hour recess every day and running not less than thirty hours of working schedule per week."

Rule 5 of Schedule III

"Classes may be conducted between 8 a.m. to 7 p.m. in a Centre of Legal Education, which is not fully residential. However the Library may remain open till 10 p.m."

Further, the institution should follow the attendance rule and file reply that they are following the aforesaid rule. The next inspection team must also see whether the said rule is being followed by the university or not. The relevant Rule 12 is given below :-

"12. End Semester Test: No student of any of the degree program shall be allowed to take the end semester test in a subject if the student concerned has not attended minimum of 70% of the classes held in the subject concerned as also the moot court room exercises, tutorials and practical training conducted in the subject taken together.

Provided that if a student for any exceptional reasons fail to attend 70% of the classes held in any subject, the Dean of the University or the Principal of the Centre of Legal Education, as the case may be, may allow the student to take the test if the student concerned attended at least 65% of the classes

held in the subject concerned and attended 70% of classes in all the subjects taken together. The similar power shall rest with the Vice Chancellor or Director of a National Law University, or his authorized representative in the absence of the Dean of Law.

Provided further that a list of such students allowed to take the test with reasons recorded be forwarded to the Bar Council of India."

University/College should also admit students as per the below mentioned Rule:

7. Minimum marks in qualifying examination for admission: Bar Council of India may from time to time, stipulate the minimum percentage of marks not below 45% of the total marks in case of general category applicants, 42% for OBC category and 40% of the total marks in case of SC and ST applicants, to be obtained for the qualifying examination, such as +2 Examination in case of Integrated Five Years' course or Degree course in any discipline for Three years' LL.B. course, for the purpose of applying for and getting admitted into a Law Degree Program of any recognized University in either of the streams.

Provided that such a minimum qualifying marks shall not automatically entitle a person to get admission into an institution but only shall entitle the person concerned to fulfill other institutional criteria notified by the institution concerned or by the government concerned from time to time to apply for admission.

Institution should submit affidavit in compliance of the above conditions within six weeks.

The University/College shall also comply with the following Rule of the Bar Council of India (Clause (iii) and Explanation 2 of Schedule IV in Part IV of new rules of the Bar Council of India):-

Whenever approval of affiliation is granted to the Centres of Legal Education, it shall be necessary for the Centres of Legal Education to deposit Rupees Five Lakh in shape of guarantee to fulfill all the norms of the Bar Council of India. The same shall be liable to be forfeited if norms are not complied with and same shall carry no interest."

The letter is subject to the payment of guarantee amount as mentioned in the above rule.

University/College authorities are also required to apply before the Bar Council of India for further extension of approval six months in advance before expiry of the period of approval of affiliation granted by the Bar Council of India. i.e. on or before 31st December, 2019.

The above recommendations have been confirmed by the General Council of the Bar Council of India on 25th and 26th May, 2018.

You are also requested to attach a copy of this letter with your compliance report.

CHAPTER-1

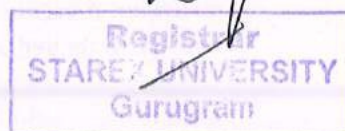
SHORT TITLE, COMMENCEMENT AND DEFINITIONS

1.1. Short title and Commencement:

- (i) The "Ordinance" means the First Ordinance of Starex University, framed under the Haryana Private Universities Act, 2006 as amended up to date.
- (ii) The Ordinance shall come into force with effect from the date of its Notification.
- (iii) The Ordinance is subject to the provisions of the Haryana Private Universities Act, 2006, as amended up to date.
- (iv) Subject to the provisions of Haryana Private Universities Act, 2006, as amended, nothing in this Ordinance shall debar the University from amending the ordinance in part as a whole.

1.2. Definitions:

- (i) The definitions, provided in section 2 of the Haryana Private Universities Act, 2006 as amended up to date shall apply to this Ordinance of Starex University Gurugram, Haryana.
- (ii) "HOD" means the Head of Department of a Faculty; or Head of a Department of a constituent unit, and/or any such post that may or designated as such by the Academic Council for the purpose of the this Ordinance.
- (iii) "Sponsoring Body" in relation to Starex University, Gurugram Haryana means Starex Foundation.
- (iv) First Ordinance means the first Ordinance of the Starex University.
- (v) "University" means Starex University, Gurugram, Haryana established as per provisions and under the Haryana Private Universities Act, 2006 as amended up to date.
- (vi) "Year" means Academic Year unless otherwise specified.
- (vii) School means a Division of the University for Teaching & Learning in a particular field.
- (viii) NRI means Non Resident Indian as defined in the Income Tax Act.



CHAPTER-2

ADMISSION OF STUDENTS AND THEIR ENROLLMENT

2.1 Schools being run

- (i) The University shall initially have the following Schools
- (ii) School of Humanities & Arts.
- (iii) School of life Sciences.
- (iv) School of Swachchh Bharat Abhiyan.
- (v) School of Agriculture Science.
- (vi) School of Health & Medical Science.
- (vii) School of Nursing.
- (viii) School of Applied Science.
- (ix) School of Computer Science.
- (x) School of Hospitality & Management.
- (xi) School of pharmacy.
- (xii) School of Law
- (xiii) Desktop Top Publication.
- (xiv) Such other School as the Governing Body, on the recommendation of the Board of Management and approval of the Academic Council may prescribe.

New faculties may be added from time to time on approval of the Governing Body of the University subject to applicable rules, regulation, guidelines and statutes.

2.2 Minimum Eligibility Criteria for Admission to the University

- 2.2.1 To be eligible for admission to the first year of any of the courses of the University, a candidate must fulfill the minimum eligibility criteria as laid down by the regulatory bodies from time to time for the particular courses which has been given in Annexure 1 to the Ordinance or otherwise as prescribed in the course ordinance where there is no regulatory Body.
- 2.2.2 Any change in the said minimum eligibility criteria for admission to any course shall be notified by the University in advance. Such minimum eligibility criteria will be notified on the official website of the University at least four weeks in advance of the start of the admission process. In addition, for convenience of the students, it may also be publicized through newspapers.

2.3 Merit / Selection Criteria for Admission

Admissions to the various courses of the University shall be made as per the following guidelines prescribed by and under section 35 of the Haryana Private Universities Act, 2006, as amended up to date.

- 2.3.1 (a) Admission in the University shall be made strictly on the basis of merit.
- (b) Merit for admission in the University may be determined either on the basis of marks or grades obtained in the entrance test conducted by University / Association of Universities/by any authorized agency or the

marks obtained in the qualifying examination. However, the admission in professional and technical courses shall be made only through an entrance test as prescribe under Sub section 2 of Section 35 of the Act.

- (c) Further, unfilled/dropout vacant seats in professional and technical course shall be filled by the University at its own level by considering the marks obtained by applicants in the qualifying examination and on the basis of their inter-se merit.

2.4 General Conditions

- 2.4.1 No student shall be admitted to the University or any other examination of the University unless he/she is eligible as per the eligibility conditions laid down in the Ordinance(s) for the relevant courses. The admission of the students to the courses will be purely provisional in force. In case, a student is found ineligible at a later stage because of any concealment/misrepresentation of fact the provisional admission granted to him/her by the University will be cancelled and he/she will have no right to admission to the course of refund of fee paid by him/her.
- 2.4.2 No student shall be admitted to any course, programme, or any examination of the University unless he/she been registered as a student of the University. This condition may be waived off for exchange of students or exchanges of scholars studying under student's exchange programme in association with any other recognized University, deemed University, Pvt. University.
- 2.4.3 Registration Branch, working under the control and supervision of the Registrar, shall maintain a register in the prescribed format and keep a record of all students (Undergraduate and Postgraduate) studying for the University examinations in various School and teaching departments or carrying on research work in the University.
- 2.4.4 A register shall be maintained, in respect of each student with the provision there in his/her name in full, name of father and mother, date of birth, permanent address, faculty/department admitted to, year of admission, particulars of the last examination passed, details of University examination appeared and their results with roll number, details of degree obtained, University scholarship/ medal/ prize awarded, if any and any serous penalty awarded to him/her by the University.
- 2.4.5 Every student shall attend his/her classes regularly as per the criteria laid down by the University and/or regulatory body. If a student remains absent, without leave of absence from his/her classes for a continuous period of seven working days without any valid reason, medical or otherwise his/her name shall be stuck off from the rolls of the University School department/faculty concerned irrespective of the fact that he/she has paid his/her dues in part or full. However, the student may be re-admitted with the permission of the Head of the Department/Director/Principal of the school/dept./faculty concerned on payment of such as prescribed of the University for the purpose from time to

time in addition to arrears of fee, if any provided that the head of the Department/Director/Principal of the School/Dept./Faculty is satisfied that if re-admitted, the student will not fall short of requisite percentage of attendance/lecturers as required under the regulation/rules.

- 2.4.6 A student from any other University or an education board (other than the board of School Education Haryana) shall be eligible for admission to the University only on the production of the Migration Certificate, and on payment of a prescribed Migration fee.

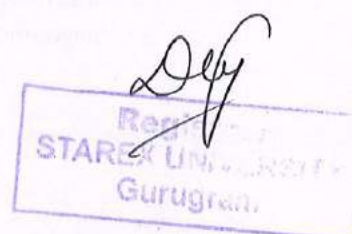
Provided that the condition of production of Migration Certificate will not apply in case of student passing the equivalent examination from a Foreign University or Board, as the case may be, recognized by the concerned regulatory body i.e. Medical Council of India, Dental Council of India, Indian Nursing Council, Indian Association of Physiotherapists, All India Council for Technical Education, National Council for Teacher Education and University Grants Commission etc.

Provided further that in cases of a real hardship, a student may be admitted provisionally, at his/her own risk and responsibility, subject to the condition that he/she shall submit his/her migration certificate to the University along with prescribed late fee.

- 2.4.7 If a candidate fails to submit the migration certificate within the prescribed period, he/she will not be allowed to appear in the end term Examination. However, in a sheer hard case, the Vice Chancellor may allow a candidate to appear in the Examination provisionally, on payment of a prescribed late fee and on submission of an affidavit signed by the applicant and attested by a first class magistrate to the effect that he/she is not appearing from any other University/Board simultaneously. If such a candidate fails to submit his/her migration certificate before the declaration of result, his/her result shall be held in suspension and be declared on submission of migration certificate with the approval of Vice Chancellor. The result will remain suspended for a period of one year from the date of declaration of main result. Thereafter it will automatically stand and cancelled.

- 2.4.8 A student, who is not registered with the University, shall pay to the University, at the time of admission through the University School/Dept./Faculty which he/she joins, University registration cum eligibility fee and the continuation fee. In case of re-admission of a student whose name is struck off from the rolls of the School/Department/Faculty, he/she shall pay the prescribed fee for making necessary entries in the University register. However, once the student is registered, no further fee for registration will be charged.

- 2.4.9 The heads of the university teaching Department/ Deans of the School shall forward to the Registrar/Deputy Registrar/Assistant Registrar of the Registration Branch, within one month of the last date of admission, the registration return for fresh students, duly filled in, in duplicate, in capital letters in the prescribed Proforma together with the fee as per chapter 6 of the Ordinance through bank draft/demand draft, drawn in favour of the Chief



Finance and Accounts officer of the University, or by any other method prescribed by the University, in respect of all the students in each class.

In case a University School/Faculty fails to remit the said fee in due time, a penalty, as prescribed, may be charged in respect of each kind of fee separately. Further, the students of the University school/teaching Department/Faculty shall not be registered till all the above fee is received in one installment and the Department/Faculty shall be responsible for the same. In case of such students as are already registered with the University, the registration number shall be indicated in the registration return, but such a student shall pay continuation fee as prescribed by the University.

- 2.4.10 If a student's name is struck off from the rolls of the constituent School/department/faculty or he/she shifts to another constituent school/university/faculty of the University or is rusticated or expelled, such a fact shall immediately be reported to the Registrar/Deputy Registrar/Assistant Registrar (Registration Branch) for record in the student's register and for such other action as may be necessary.
- 2.4.11 The Head of Department/principal/dean of constituent School/Faculty shall not make admissions over and above the sanctioned strength. Such admissions shall not be regularized by the University.
- 2.4.12 Students registered under this Ordinance shall be called "Students of Starex University".
- 2.4.13 On registration, the student shall be allowed a registration number and intimated to him/her through the department/director/principal/dean of the constituent school/department/faculty in case of regular students, that registration number shall be quoted in all correspondence with the University.
- 2.4.14 Application for correction in the particulars of a student/candidate shall be entertained by the Registration Branch within 30 days from the date of intimation registration without any fee. Application received after this period shall be entertained only with the prescribed late fee.
- 2.4.15 Application for admission to University examination shall be scrutinized with reference to the University register. The Controller of Examinations may refuse to accept the application of a candidate about whom complete particulars have not been reported or have been reported incorrectly and requires him/her to forward a complete statement of the particulars together with an additional prescribed fee. Such particulars shall, in the case of a student on the rolls of a school/faculty/dean be forwarded to the Head of Department/ Director/ Principal/dean concerned.
- 2.4.16 The registered students is entitled to get a certified copy of the entries against his/her name on prescribed payment, provided them such entries are not confidential or secret.
- 2.4.17 The name of student is entered in the register on the basis of his/her matriculation/10+2 certificate of a Board or equivalent certificate. Therefore, a student intending to change his/her name in the register shall have to get the

same changed in his/her matriculation/10+2 certificate from the concerned Board and then to apply to the University for change in the Register and in the DMCs issued by the University along with the prescribed fee per certificate/DMC, to this effect.

2.5 NUMBER OF SEATS

- 2.5.1 The number of seats in each course will be notified in the admission brochure for the year of admission and which shall be as per prescription/approval of the respective regulating bodies. Whatever applicable. The reservation of seats IN all undergraduates and postgraduate courses will be as per section 35 (3) of the Haryana Private Universities Act, 2006, as amending up to date.

Provided that a minimum of 25% seats for admission in the University shall be reserved for students belonging to Haryana Domicile, out of which 10% shall be reserved for Scheduled Castes of the State of Haryana.

- 2.5.2 Fifteen percent of total seats will remain reserved for children/wards of Non-Resident Indians (NRIs).
- 2.5.3 One additional seat in each branch may be reserved for Kashmiri migrants, if available.

2.6 Eligibility under various categories

- 2.6.1 ALL INDIA (including Haryana). A candidate applying from any part of the country (including Haryana), who complies with the minimum eligibility criteria.
- 2.6.2 HARYANA (General): A candidate, who is domicile of Haryana and complies with the minimum eligibility criteria. Unfilled seats, if any, under this category will be transferred to the All India (including Haryana) category.
- 2.6.3 HARYANA (Scheduled Castes): The candidate must be a domicile of Haryana and belong to a scheduled caste of Haryana as notified by State Govt. and should comply with the minimum eligibility criteria. Unfilled seats, if any, under this category will be transferred to the All India (including Haryana) category.
- 2.6.4 CHILDREN/WARD OF NRI (NON-RESIDENT INDIANS): To be eligible for admission under this category, the applicant must be an actual of NRI or be the child/ward of a Non Resident Indian as defined under the Income Tax Act and must comply with the minimum eligibility criteria. Students admitted under this category will pay fees as given in the fee structure/ prescribed in the Ordinance, or, if revised, as per the applicable Admission Notification/ Guidelines of the State Government, and will be admitted on merit determined on the basis of the marks of qualifying examination.
- 2.6.5 KASHMIRI MIGRANTS: One seat in each branch may be reserved for Kashmiri migrants. This seat will be supernumerary and will be filled on the basis of inter-se merit, on the basis of marks of qualifying examination and subject to the candidate complying with the minimum eligibility criteria. Kashmiri

migrants will be required to submit the original certificate of migration duly signed by the competent authority.

- 2.6.6 UNFILLED SEATS: The unfilled seat (s), if any, under Haryana General and/or NRI category (excluding Kashmiri migrants) will be transferred to the All India Category including Haryana.

2.7 Admission Committee

- 2.7.1 The University shall have a Central Admission Committee constituted under Statute of the First Statutes of the University, which shall be chaired by the Vice Chancellor. The Central Admission Committee will decide the policy guidelines relating admission to various courses as per the Act, prescription of the Regulating Bodies as specified under Statute 27 of the First Statutes. For prescription the admission process, the Central Admission Committee may be assisted by Course Admission Committees.
- 2.7.2 Admission to each course shall be made by the respective course Admission Committee. The Course Admission Committee will be formed by the Vice Chancellor in consultation with the respective school Department/Faculty and will comprise the Faculty and administrative staff of the university on year basis. The Vice Chancellor shall have the power to co-opt external expert (s) as member(s) of any course Admission Committee if he/she may deem necessary. Course Admission Committee will be headed by the Registrar/ Deputy Registrar or a person who is not less than the rank of a professor.
- 2.7.3 The Course Admission Committee will scrutinize the application forms for admission of the candidates, and will take all such steps or actions so as to educational the qualification of a
Candidate
whether in accordance with the eligibility criteria prescribed in the prospectus/ Regulations Ordinance and/or Statutes of the University and the regulatory bodies as applicable. The Course Admission Committee may conduct an entrance test, personal interview, and/or counseling, and/or any other mode, which may be necessary and prescribed under the rules and regulations.
- 2.7.4 The Course Admission Committee shall forward its recommendations to the Central Admission Committee/Vice Chancellor for approval.
- 2.7.5 The decision of the Central Admission Committee on any matter concerning the admission policy and selection procedure and on any specific case/denial of admission shall be final and binding on all concerned, subject to review as provided in the Ordinance.
- 2.7.6 Constitution of the Central Admission Committee shall be in accordance with the statutes/ordinance.

2.8 Admission Notice

- 2.8.1 A copy of the Admission Notice for various courses, along with the admission Information Brochure/Prospectus for the year of admission, based on the

Ordinance, will be uploaded on the Official Website of the University for the information of all concerned, and also be got published in newspapers.

2.8.2 Adequate time from the time of publication of the admission notice shall be given to the aspiring candidates to submit their application forms and processing fee to the University in newspapers.

2.8.3 If not provided in the admission notice, the notice shall clearly provide the uniform resource locator (URL) or address, of the Official Website of the University from where the following information can be obtained.

- (a) Minimum eligibility conditions for applicants seeking admission.
- (b) The number of seats, branch wise/category wise to be filled up.
- (c) Fee to be paid by the students.
- (d) Schedule of entrance or qualifying examination, if applicable.
- (e) The date, time and venue for the display of admission list and/or physical counseling, as the case may be.
- (f) Any other relevant matter.

2.8.4 Admission shall be made strictly on merit only from amongst the candidates, who have applied within the stipulated time limit prescribed in the admission notice prospectus published by the University on the Website and/or Newspapers and have deposited the processing fee in time and whose admission has not been invalidate/rejected.

2.9 Processing Fee

A processing fee, as decided and approved by the University from time to time, must be submitted along with the duly completed application forms. The University reserves its right to assess or fix different processing fees in respect of Resident Indian Students: children/wards of Non Resident; and Foreign Students.

The processing fee shall not be refunded under any circumstances whatsoever.

2.10 Grievance Redressal

2.10.1 Grievance/Complaints, if any against any action/decision the Course Admission Committee can be made in writing to the Vice Chancellor, of the University within the time frame as specified in the Admission Brochure, regulations and the Vice Chancellor of the University shall address the same within the prescribed time.

2.10.2 In case of any ambiguity in the admission notice Prospectus, Ordinance, or any other matter relating to admissions, Vice Chancellor's written interpretation/clarification/ clarification/ decision shall be final and binding on all concerned.

2.11 Cancellation of Admission/ Refund of Admission Fee

2.11.1 All requests for cancellation/withdrawal of admission must be made in writing over before the last date of admission along with the original fee receipt quoting the course in which admission was granted, Admission, Roll Number/

Provisional Registration Number/ Entrance Test/Joint Entrance Test/ All India Engineering Entrance Examination Roll Number & rank. Requests made verbally or by fax/e-mail or without the original fee receipt shall not be entertained.

- 2.11.2 In case a student withdraws his/her admission before the last date of admission, the fee deposited by him/her shall be refunded after deducting processing fees prescribed by the University.
- 2.11.3 The refund shall be made in the name of the student by Crossed Account Payee Cheque only and shall be mailed by Registered/speed Post to the student within one month from the last date of admission or earlier.
- 2.11.4 No vacancy, is permissible to be filled up, (that may arise after the last date of admission.) Therefore, in case of withdrawal after the last date of admission, it will be classified as a mid-course withdrawal and the candidate shall be liable to pay the University the fee for the whole course.

2.12 Ragging

- 2.12.1 Ragging, its abetment, eve-teasing and/or any kind of mental or physical harassment, either directly or indirectly, of any student(S), by whatsoever name called, which may hurt his/her sensible self-esteem inside or outside the university and inside, hostels(s)/ mess, cafeteria etc. is strictly prohibited.
- 2.12.2 Disorderly conduct whether by words spoken, or written or by an act, which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness towards/with any other student(s), including activities of indiscipline which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in a fresher or junior student(s) or asking the student(s) to do any act or perform something, which such student(s) will not do in the ordinary course and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of a fresher or a junior student shall constitute an act of ragging.
- 2.12.3 University authorities shall constitute anti ragging, committee as per the directions/guidelines of the Hon'ble Supreme Court/State Government of Haryana and control anti- ragging squad shall take other appropriate steps as deemed necessary for curbing the menace of ragging.
- 2.12.4 Ragging will attract strict departmental disciplinary action and may leave to suspension and/or expulsion of the student from the University in addition to any other suitable legal action simultaneously.

2.13 Assistance to the Candidates seeking admission

The process of admission will be kept transparent. In order to provide information regarding to all aspects of admission process during admission, the university may nominate an executive and or create a help desk for the assistance of the candidate, desirous of seeking admission in the university and to answer their telephonic/e-mail queries.



2.14 Limited liability

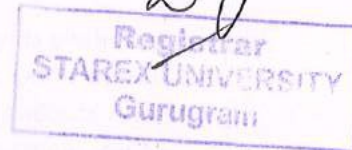
All admission made by the admission committee are provisional and subject to confirmation by the Vice Chancellor of the University. If the admission of any candidate(s) is not confirmed by the Vice-Chancellor of the University, for any reason whatsoever the liability of the university and its employees will be limited only to the refund of fees as prescribed in the relevant ordinance rules and nothing further.

2.15 Jurisdiction

Disputes, if any arising out of any admission policy/procedure of the University shall be subject to the Gurugram Court Jurisdiction only.

2.16 Amendments to admission policies/procedures

The ordinance and the admission policies/procedures may be reviewed and amended by the university from time to time of the approval of the Competent Authority.



CHAPTER-3

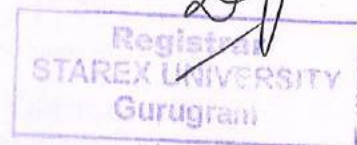
AWARD OF DIGREE, DIPLOMAS, CERTIFICATES AND OTHER ACADEMIC DISTINCTIONS

- 3.1 Awarding degrees, diplomas, certificates and other academic distinctions by the University shall be as follows:
- 3.2 The students who have been enrolled in various certificate, diploma or degree courses in the University, on successful completion and passing of prescribed examinations, shall become entitled to the award of corresponding certificate, diploma or degree for that course, as the case may be, as provided in the respective course Ordinance.
- 3.3 The curriculum and scheme of examination shall be as given in the respective course, Ordinance. A student shall be deemed to have successfully completed the course and will be eligible to appear in the examination provided he/she has:
- (a) Completed the 75% attendance in the theory and practical/seminars etc. as provided in the relevant course Ordinance approved by the Academic Council or as per regulations of the regulatory body, if any.
 - (b) Completed all the requirements within the stipulated time prescribed for course.
 - (c) No fee/ or any other arrears are pending against him/her.
 - (d) Complied with any other requirements as prescribed in the relevant course Ordinance.
- 3.4 Where the number of chances for passing a particular examination are limited, a candidate who fails to pass the examination within the limited chances may be considered for an additional chance by the Vice Chancellor on his /her written request on genuine reasons/medical ground on payment of such fee as prescribed by the University from time to time.
- 3.5 Save as provided in the course ordinance, the successful candidate shall be classified in division, as under:

- 3.6 The certificate/diplomas/degree shall be issued by the Controller of Examinations under his signature. However, the degrees shall bear the signature of Chancellor, Vice-Chancellor and Registrar. The Provisional Certificate, to be issued in lieu of original degree on payment of such fee as prescribed by the University, shall be issued by the Controller of Examinations under his signature till the original degree is prepared and

conferred on the student(s). This Provisional Certificate will serve the purpose of original Degree till then.

3.7 The certificate/diplomas/degree will be awarded to the students on University convocation as decided by the University from time to time. However, a student may be awarded his/her Certificate/Diploma/Degree in absentia on valid reasons explained by the student in his/her application for the purpose, accompanied by a fee as prescribed by the University from time to time alongwith the convincing reason(s) therefor. A candidate may also be admitted to his/her Degree, Diploma/ Certificate before convocation on a written request accompanied by a fee as prescribed/stipulated the convince of personal therefore.

3.8 The University convocation shall ordinarily be held every academic year and the dates for the convocation shall be notified by the Registrar well in advance to all the students and the invitees. The University may hold a special convocation at any time with the approval of Academic Council/Chancellor. The conferment of honorary degree or distinction D.Sc. (Honoris causa) and D.Lit. (Honoris causa) shall subject to the prior approval of the Visitor as per Section 30(1) (g) of the Act.



CHAPTER-4

FEE CONCESSION, SCHOLARSHIP, FELLOWSHIP, MEDAL AND PRIZES

4.1 Fee Concession, Scholarship, Fellowship, Medal and Prizes

4.2 The Student Awards and Scholarships Committee

The fee concession/scholarships/fellowship/medals/prizes shall be awarded on the recommendation of a Standing Committee known as Student Awards and Scholarships Committee. The recommendation of the committee will be considered and approved by Academic Council. Award and Scholarships Committee shall consist of the following members:

4.3 Eligibility for fee concessions/scholarships

4.3.1 As per provisions of the Haryana Private Universities Act 2006, the University will grant scholarship/fee concession to students of the University on merit-cum-means basis.

4.3.2 The fee concessions to the students of the University will be awarded on the basis of merit-cum-means and shall be awarded to 25% of students, who are domicile of Haryana, in accordance with the provision in the Haryana Private University Act, 2006 to this effect and shall be known as Starex University Scholarships/fee concessions.

4.3.3 Starex University Scholarships in the form of fee concession, for the 25% of total intake of students, who are domicile of Haryana, shall be based on merit-cum-means as follows:

- (i) 5% shall be granted full fee concession.
- (ii) 10% shall be granted 50% fee concession.
- (iii) 10% shall be granted 25% fee concession.

4.3.4 The actual expenses on account of Starex University Scholarships in the form of fee concessions for all the courses running under the University would be provided for, after completion of the admission process each year, based on the total seats.

- 4.3.5 Notwithstanding the award of Starex University Scholarships in the form of fee concessions and a ward of other scholarships, all candidates selected for admission will have to deposit their admission fee to secure their admission. On grant of Starex University Scholarships, Student's Awards and Scholarships Committee, the Scholarship amount will be disbursed directly to the admitted students.
- 4.3.6 Fee concession will be granted to the students admitted in the first year on the basis of performance in the entrance examination/qualifying examination and other academic and extra-curricular accomplishments on merit-cum-means basis and in the later years on the basis of their satisfactory academic performance during the course of study.
- 4.3.7 Students already getting fee concession from any other Government/ Government Organizations/ Institutes shall not be eligible for the fee concession by the University.
- 4.3.8 However, meritorious students may receive more than one scholarship/research funding/ research grants, and the fact that they are receiving such merit scholarship shall not bar them from being eligible for fee concessions.
- 4.3.9 Any income as merit scholarship/ research funding/ research grants shall not be taken into account while assessing merit-cum-means.

4.4 Application for fee concession

- 4.4.1 Interested eligible candidates under clauses here in above shall submit their application in the prescribed form along with the required documentary proofs, as applicable, on or before the last date notified each year by the University at the commencement of the academic session.
- 4.4.2 Candidates may be called for interaction with the Committee to help in assessment of their financial position to evaluate their application against merit-cum-means criteria. Failure of the candidate to appear before the committee, if required, may invalidate the application and/ or delay the reimbursement.

4.5 Eligibility for Continuity of fee concession

The Student:


- (i) Must have obtained 60% marks in aggregate in the lower examination.
- (ii) Must meet the attendance criteria of the University.
- (iii) Should not have any charge(s) of indiscipline against him/her.
- (iv) Should have cleared all the main examinations in first attempt.
- (v) Fee concession may be withdrawn if the candidate fails to fulfil the above criteria at any time subsequently.

In case the students fail to meet the criteria under clause 4.5 above on completion of the first year, the Standing Committee for Fee Concession and Scholarships, or a sub-

committee thereof, at its sole discretion after counseling the student, may allow continuation of fee concession for one more under deserving circumstances.

4.6 Induction of Scholarships, medals and prizes

- (i) The University shall facilitate/encourage an organization, or an individual, intending to sponsor scholarship, medal and/or prize etc. in the name of organization or individual. The University may enter into Memorandum of understanding (MOU) with them to facilitate the process of grant of scholarship/medal to the meritorious students.
- (ii) The University may provide for award of scholarships, medals and prizes from its own funds or funds received as donations as per rules of the University in conformity with the provisions of Haryana Private University Act. The number and value of scholarships, medal and prizes to be awarded shall be determined by the Board of Management of the University, either on its own initiative or on the recommendation of Standing Committee for Fee Concession/Scholarships.
- (iii) Scholarships, medals and prizes will be awarded on the basis of academic/other achievements as decided by the Board of Management/ Standing Committee for Fee Concession/Scholarships.

CHAPTER-5

CONDUCT OF EXAMINATIONS

Admission to examinations

- 5.1 Applications for admissions to an examination shall be made on the prescribed form accompanied by the requisite fee to reach the Examination Branch by the date fixed for the purpose.
- 5.2 Application form for admission to the examination shall be accompanied by the following certificates signed by the authority specified in the regulation/rules and as provided in the application form itself.
- (a) Of good character.
 - (b) That the candidate is eligible to appear in the examinations under the Ordinance prescribed for the examination concerned.
 - (c) Any other certificate(s) required under the Ordinances.
- 5.3 In the case of an ex-student, the application form for admission to an examination shall be accompanied by a certificate signed by the Director/Principal/Head of the constituent Schools/Faculty/Department, last attended, that the candidate completed the prescribed course of lectures, etc., within the period specified in the Ordinance for the examinations.
- 5.4 All candidates are required to submit three copies of recent passport size colour photographs out of which two copies will be fixed on the Admission-cum-Roll Number Card and one copy will be fixed on the Admission form at the space provided for this purpose. On the front portion of each photograph, the candidate will write his/her name, which will be attested by the same authority who attests the admission form.
- 5.5 The Academic Council shall have the power to exclude any candidate from appearing in the examination permanently or for a specified period for reasons to be recorded, if it is satisfied that such a candidate is not fit and proper person to be admitted to the examination.
- 5.6 If a candidate after admission to an examination:
- (a) Commits an act of moral turpitude.
 - (b) Is discovered to have committed an immoral act which in the opinion of the Vice-Chancellor, Academic Council is such that had it come to their knowledge in time, they would have excluded him/her from the examination, the Vice-Chancellor/Academic Council after an enquiry may:
 - (i) Cancel his/her candidature; and/or
 - (ii) Disqualify him/her permanently or for a specified period.
- 5.7 If a candidate, before issue of roll number or before appearance in an examination, is found to be ineligible to take the examination, his/her candidature may be cancelled by the Deputy Registrar/Assistant Registrar (Examinations).

5.8 If a candidate, subsequent to the issue of Roll number or subsequent to appearance in an examination, is found to be ineligible to take the examination, his/her candidature shall be cancelled by the controller of examination.

5.9 (a) Where a candidate for an examination in which the number of chances available are limited, has missed one or more chances on account of illness, only one additional chance may be allowed by the Vice Chancellor if the candidate after having submitted his/her admission form and fee, informs the Controller of Examination before the commencement of the university examination, of his/her inability to appear in the examination and also furnishes a Medical Certificate from Civil Surgeon or the Medical Officer authorized by the University. This additional chance shall be availed of immediately next to the last admissible chance.

(b) Where chances of the candidate to clear an examination are limited, the Academic Council may grant an extra chance, for valid reason other than illness, in lieu of one or more chance(s) missed by a candidate for no fault of his/her own, provided that the extra chance(s) shall be availed of immediately next to the last admissible chance.

Provided that the condition of maximum period, wherever prescribed, for passing an examination shall stand relaxed upto that extent.

5.10 A candidate who misses one or more chances of appearing in an examination due to late receipt of result of his/her use of unfair means case in which he/she is exonerated of the charge(s) or due to late receipt of result of re-evaluation/re-checking of answer books, where applicable, may be allowed one additional chance by the vice-Chancellor.

Provided that the condition of maximum period prescribed for passing an examination shall not apply in such cases upto that extent.

5.11 Unless otherwise provided, a person who

(a) Has already passed an examination of this University or any other University shall not be permitted to re-appear in that examination or a corresponding examination again.

(b) A candidate for an examination in full subject of this University cannot simultaneously read for or appear at another examination of his University or of another University/Board, in full subjects, in the same academic year.

The bar shall not apply to a candidate appearing in another examination of the University for passing or for improvement of division/result or for additional subject; provided that he/she does not take the examination in more than two subjects/papers simultaneously with the full subjects of his/her main examination.

5.12 Notwithstanding anything contained in any other Ordinance, the Academic Council shall, for reasons to be recorded, have power to admit a student provisionally to the next higher class pending his/her qualifying the paper or papers, which he/she may have missed for no fault of his/her own. The Academic Council shall record reasons for granting such permission in each case.

5.13 A prisoner, undergoing a term of imprisonment, may be allowed to appear in an examination if:

- (a) A certificate of good conduct is given by the Superintendent of the Jail concerned or otherwise permitted by the Court.
- (b) He/she is eligible under the Ordinance for examination concerned and also under the Ordinance for ex-students.

Such examination, in sheer, hard cases, may be arranged in the Jail and the expenditure so involved shall be paid to the University by the Jail authorities.

5.14 Submission of Examination Forms and Fee

5.14.1 Extension of last date(s):

- (a) The Vice-Chancellor may, when he/she considers it appropriate in any exceptional case:
 - (i) Extend the date for submission of examination Admission forms and fee by the constituent School/Faculty/University Department, keeping in view the circumstances; and
 - (ii) Accept the Examination Admission form and fee after the expiry of the last date with late fee as prescribed by the University from time to time.
- (b) If the result of any particular candidate(s) is declared late or is revised due to re-checking/re-evaluation of answer book(s) before the last date fixed for the submission of admission forms without late fee, the candidate may submit the examination admission form along with fee by the following dates:
 - (i) Without late fee: Within 15 days of the date of declaration of result.
 - (ii) With prescribed late fee: Within 30 days of the date of declaration of result.
 - (iii) With usual late fee as prescribed for the relevant period, before the commencement of examination and after the expiry of date as mentioned in (i & ii) above.
- (c) The Vice-Chancellor may condone the late fee in case a Department or a constituent School/Faculty/Department has failed to deposit the Examination fee in full, within the prescribed period/last date, through a clerical mistake, viz. totaling of the amount payable, rate of examination fee payable, etc.

5.14.2 For the purpose of calculating late fee, the date of remittance of amount by the candidate from the Bank shall be taken as the date of receipt thereof by the University.

5.14.3 A candidate who:

- (i) Fails to present himself/herself for an examination; or
- (ii) Has appeared in an examination provisionally and is subsequently declared ineligible by the Controller of examinations or an Officer authorized by him/her, according to the Ordinances, shall not be entitled to refund of fee or to have it kept in deposit for a subsequent examination.

5.14.4 A candidate shall not be entitled to refund of examination fee paid by him/her:

- (i) If permission accorded to him/her to take an examination is subsequently cancelled, as a result of misrepresentation/suppression of facts.
- (ii) If he/she tried to obtain admission to an examination by making a false statement of facts in his/her Admission form.

5.14.5 Refund of examination fee shall not be allowed

- (a) When a candidate's name is struck off for non-payment of School/Faculty/Department dues.
- (b) When a candidate's name is struck off on account of his/her rustication or expulsion from the Department /Constituent School/Faculty or his/her character certificate is found contrary to his/her conduct.

5.15 Detention/Cancellation of candidature for appearing in the Examination.

- 5.15.1 (a) The Candidature of a candidate for appearing in the examination in Particular subject(s) in which he/she falls short of attendance and the same has not been made up nor condoned in accordance with the Ordinance may be detained from appearing in the exam in that particular subject(s)/paper(s), wherever prescribed in the relevant Ordinance.
- (b) The Candidature of a candidate for appearing in the examination shall stand detained/cancelled if his/her name is struck off from the rolls of the University teaching department/constituent School provided that such action is taken before the commencement of examination.
- (c) The Candidature of a candidate shall stand detained/cancelled if he/she is rusticated or expelled from the University Department/ Constituent School or his/her character certificate is withdrawn for misconduct before the commencement of examination.
- (d) When the candidature of a candidate is to be cancelled before his/her appearance in the examination on grounds of his/her being ineligible,

the Assistant Registrar/Deputy Registrar (Exam) concerned is authorized to pass the order.

- (e) The Controller of examination shall have the authority to cancel the candidature of a candidate for any university examination on grounds of his/her ineligibility after he/she had actually appeared in it and to cancel his/her result accordingly.

5.16 Declaration and Publication of Result

5.16.1 The controller of examination will publish the result of various examinations as prescribed in the Haryana Private University Act, 2006 and/or as directed /advised by Academic Council of the University.

5.16.2 However, if on scrutiny of the pass percentage, it appears that there has been a distinct change of standards in the examination as a whole or in a particular subject, the matter shall be submitted to the Vice-Chancellor, who may refer the matter to the Examiner(s) concerned for report or may take such action as he/she may consider necessary.

5.16.3 The result of the students, after publication, shall be communicated to the Head of the Department/Director/Principal/Dean of the constituent School/Faculty/Department concerned.

5.16.4 After the publication of the result, the result cards of the students, showing the subject wise marks/grades obtained, will be sent to the Head of Department/Director/Principal of the constituent School/Faculty/Department as per concerned ordinance.

5.17 Rectification of Results

5.17.1 The Vice Chancellor shall have power to quash/revise the result of a candidate after it has been /declared, if:

- (a) She/he is disqualified for using unfair means in the examination; or
- (b) A mistake is found in his/her result; or
- (c) He/she is found ineligible to appear in the examination; or
- (d) If so directed by a court of law of competent jurisdiction.

5.18 Re-checking/re-evaluation of answer books

5.18.1 A candidate shall be entitled to have his/her answer-books re-checked/re-evaluated, wherever applicable, on payment of fee as prescribed by the University per answer-book, as follows:

- (a) Application for re-checking/re-evaluation, as the case may be, is received by the examiner of the University within 15 days of the date on which result is declared by the University.
- (b) Re-checking will be done only to see if the marks awarded to various answers have been correctly added and that all the answers have been assessed by the Examiner.

- (c) In case of a request for re-evaluation, decision shall be taken as per regulation/guidelines of respective regulatory body (ies). Whenever re-evaluation is applicable, the answer-books will be got re-evaluated from the examiner other than the original examiner as per the rules and regulations of the University.

5.18.2 If any mistake is discovered as a result of re-checking of answer-books or the nature of result changes on account of re-evaluation of answer-books, the Controller of Examination will have power to rectify/revise the result.

5.18.3 The candidate intended to apply for re-checking/re-evaluation of answer-books should ascertain before applying for the same that re-checking/re-evaluation is permissible under the rules and that they are applying within the prescribed time. In case, the application of a student for re-checking/re-evaluation of answer-books is rejected on such grounds, the fee paid by them will not be refunded.

5.18.4 There shall be no re-evaluation in respect of the following or as expressly prohibited by the rules/regulations in the concerned course Ordinance.

- (a) MBBS and M.Sc. (Medical/Diploma examinations.
- (b) BDS and MDS examinations.
- (c) BPT, MPT, B.A.M.S., B.Sc. Nursing, Post Basic Nursing, GNM and any other Medical/Dental Streams unless, provided by the regulation of the respective regulating bodies.
- (d) Laboratory/Practical examination, viva-voice/sessional, thesis/dissertation evaluation and project report evaluation etc.

5.19 RE-Examinations

Notwithstanding anything contained in any other Ordinance/Regulations, the academic Council shall have the power, in respect of all examinations held by the University, to hold a re-examination in the same year for special reasons to be recorded.

5.20 Place of Suing

All legal disputes relating to examinations/admission of students will subject to Courts having Jurisdiction in Gurgaon.

5.21 General Provision regarding conduct of examinations

5.21.1 Conduct of Examinations: Subject to the Ordinance and directions issued by the Academic Council, the Controller of Examinations shall be responsible for all arrangements in connection with the conduct of examinations and all matters connected therewith.

5.21.2 All Faculties/Departments/Schools to assist conduct of Examinations

- (a) Every Faculty/Schools /University teaching department shall, for supervision of the University examinations, recommend the names of

such number of teachers as are required by the Controller of Examinations. In making these recommendations, the guidelines, if any, issued by the Controller of Examinations shall be kept in consideration/view.

- (b) If a teacher, who is assigned the examination duty, fails to perform the same, he/she shall be treated as absent from his/her School/Department/Faculty for relevant period besides rendering him/her liable to such other disciplinary action, including debarring him/her from any University Examination, as the Vice Chancellor deems appropriate.

5.21.3 Superintendents

- (a) The Superintendents of each examination center shall be appointed by the Controller of Examinations.
- (b) For observing the proper and smooth functioning of the center, the flying squad(s), headed by a convener shall be appointed by the Controller of Examinations. The convener of the flying squad(s) shall not ordinarily be below the rank of Associate Professor of the constituent School/Departments/Faculty or a Lecturer/Assistant Professor with at least 10 years' experience.
- (c) The Controller of Examinations may appoint one or more members of the flying squads/observer(s) who should not be below the rank of an Assistant Professor/Lecturer of the University teaching department or constituent School having at least two years teaching experience.
- (d) Where no requirement of appointment of flying squad(s) is deemed necessary, the Controller of Examination may appoint one or two observer(s) in lieu thereof.

5.21.4 Missing/Misplaced/Lost Answer Books

- (a) A candidate whose answer-books(s) is/are lost after having been received by the center Superintendent of Examinations and who, but for this answer-books, would have either passed the examination or is likely to be placed in compartment/re-appear shall, unless he/she opts for the examination on a date to be fixed by the Controller of Examinations, be deemed to have obtained in that paper marks equal to the marks obtained by him/her in the other theory papers of the same Subject and if there is no theory paper in that Subject or if there are more than two theory papers in that Subject, marks equal to the average of the marks obtained by him/her in other theory papers. Half the prescribed examination fee will be charged from the candidate for re-examination if he/she opts for re-examination.
- (b) In case of a dispute as to whether the candidate's answer-book(s) was duly received or not, the finding of the Controller of Examinations, subject to confirmation of Vice Chancellor, shall be final.

5.22 Type of Examinations

5.22.1 Wherever not otherwise provided in any course ordinance, there will be two type of examinations, at the University:

- (a) **End term:** End term examination shall be held at the end of each semester/academic year, as the case be, and will cover the entire syllabus for that semester/academic year.
- (b) **Internal Test:** There may be one/two Internal Assessment test(s) in each semester/ academic years, as the case may be. Each Internal Assessment test will cover the syllabus taught up to the date of test.
- (c) The other components of the Internal Assessment would be as prescribed in the concerned course ordinance.

5.22.2 Practical Examinations

Practical Examination(s) shall be held as provided in the respective curriculum/ordinance for the course.

5.23 Academic Year

The academic year is for a period of approximately twelve months and comprises two semesters as per the Ordinance of various courses/programmers, wherever there is a semester scheme.

5.24 Date of Examination

The dates of all the examinations shall be as per the University Academic Calendar or as fixed by the Vice Chancellor/Academic council from time to time.

5.25 Printing of question papers: -

Ordinarily there will be in house printing of question papers or as decided by the controller of examinations in consultation with the vice chancellor.

The controller of examinations of the University will maintain complete secrecy in printing and distribution of question papers among examinees.

5.26 The answer books shall ordinarily be evaluated centrally in the University premises by the internal/external examiners as provided in the relevant course ordinance Paper setter may also act as evaluator if he/she does not belong to the remote area.

Answer sheets of the internal assessment tests/tutorials/project work/Indus trial training report etc. place shall be evaluated by the concerned faculty under the control & supervision of the head of department/ faculty/school.

5.27 Submission & Display of Grades (Whenever applicable/prescribed):

The marks obtained/grades of a course will be forwarded by the Course Coordinator in a consolidated form to the Controller of Examinations. The Grades shall be calculated at the level of Controller of Examinations. Any moderation of grades as per procedure mentioned in "Course Credit Regulations & Grading System" and compilation of results including due check of all its aspects will be done at the level of Controller of

Examinations. After rectifications & correction if any, the Controller of Examinations shall display the final result.

5.28 Instructions to the candidates for examination

- 5.28.1 The examination hall shall be opened each day at least 30 minutes before the scheduled time of commencement of examination. All the candidates must be in the examination hall 10 minutes before the commencement of examination. No candidate, who is late by more than half an hour, shall be admitted to the examination hall.
- 5.28.2 When a candidate leaves the examination hall, she/he shall, before doing so, hand over his/her answer-book to the Assistant Superintendent/Invigilator concerned. After having left the hall as such, he/she will not be readmitted to the Hall and no extra time shall be allowed to a candidate who arrives late in the examination hall without any fault on the part of the University.
- 5.28.3 No candidate shall be permitted to leave the hall till half the time is over, after the distribution of the question paper. A candidate leaving the examination hall after the half time is over will not be allowed to take the question paper with him/her. He/she will only be allowed to take the question paper with him/her after full time is over. Each candidate shall occupy in respective time seat allotted to him/her by writing/mentioning his/her roll number thereon.
- 5.28.4 Each candidate shall write on the front page of his/her answer-book, his/her roll number and other particulars in the space provided and roll number on the question paper delivered to him/her.
- 5.28.5 All candidates are required to bring their own pens and no one is allowed to tear out any leaf from his/her answer-book.
- 5.28.6 A candidate shall show his/her valid identity card/admit card on demand and shall not put his/her name/roll number or any other identification mark including mobile number, on any page of the answer-book.
- 5.28.7 Every candidate shall show his/her valid identity card/admit card on demand and put his/her signature against his/her name in the attendance sheet when directed to do so by the Centre Superintendent /assistant superintendent failing which he/she may not be admitted to the examination and may be asked to leave the examination centre forthwith.

5.29 Duties of Centre Superintendent and Assistant Superintendent of examinations

- 5.29.1 The Centre Superintendent shall ensure that the examination hall is opened 30 minutes before the commencement of examination.
- 5.29.2 The Controller of Examinations shall supply to the Centre Superintendent, before the commencement of examination, a confidential list containing the particulars of the examinee(s) along with the subjects/optional papers taken up by them.
- 5.29.3 The Centre Superintendent shall not admit any candidate to the examination whose name does not exist in the confidential list or allow any candidate to

take examination in any paper/optional paper other than that shown against his/her name in the confidential list. Provided that, in doubtful cases, the Centre Superintendent may allow a candidate to take the paper provisionally at his/her risk and responsibility and immediately thereafter refer the matter to the Controller of Examinations for confirmation/clarification. The answer book(s) of such a candidate will be sent to the Controller of Examinations as a stray case in a separate cover.

- 5.29.4 The question papers, set for the examination, shall be delivered to the Centre Superintendent by the Controller of Examinations in a sealed cover/bag which shall be opened by the Centre Superintendent in the presence of two members of the Supervisory staff /Observer if any. The Superintendent /Assistant Superintendent/Observer shall sign the question paper opening certificate certifying that the sealed cover/bag was in proper condition and that it was opened in the examination hall at the proper time. This certificate shall be forwarded to the controller of Examinations on the same date. Provided that if there is only one Assistant Superintendent on any particular day, the question paper shall be opened in the presence of Assistant Superintendent and the HOD/Principal of the Constituent School/Faculty and the Observer, if any.
- 5.29.5 Before the commencement of the examination, the Centre Superintendent shall ensure that the seating arrangement in the examination hall is proper and has been made in such a way so as to avoid mutual copying by the examinees.
- 5.29.6 Adequate blank answer sheets shall be supplied by the Examination Branch of the University.
- 5.29.7 The Centre Superintendent shall remain in the examination hall during the time allotted for each paper and shall immediately draw the attention of the Controller of Examinations to any misprint, wrong translation or any other discrepancy in the question papers which comes to his/her notice.
- 5.29.8 Immediately after the time allotted is over, the Centre Superintendent shall collect the answer-sheets from the invigilators, have them arranged roll number wise, pack them securely and send the same to the Controller of Examinations immediately thereafter.
- 5.29.9 The Centre Superintendent is expected to be frugal in expenditure, to be incurred in all matters.
- 5.29.10 Any attempt to use unfair means in the examination or any violation of the rules by the candidates shall immediately be reported by the Centre Superintendent to the Controller of Examinations.
- 5.29.11 If, in the opinion of the Centre Superintendent, it is necessary to permit a candidate to leave the examination hall during the Examination for a brief period, he /she shall be accompanied by the Supervisor/Invigilator put on the outside duty. The Centre Superintendent may fix time, if necessary, within which the candidate must return to his/her seat.

5.29.12 ordinarily, one Assistant Superintendent shall be appointed for every 30 candidates but the Centre Superintendent may appoint an additional Assistant Superintendent with the approval of the Controller of Examinations.

5.29.13 Assistant Superintendents shall remain in the examination hall during the time allotted for each paper and shall not leave the hall without the permission of the Centre Superintendent.

5.29.14 In case, an Assistant Superintendent is unable to discharge his duty on account of unavoidable circumstances, he/she shall inform the Assistant Registrar/Deputy Registrar of the Conduct Branch immediately so as to make alternative arrangement in his/her place.

5.29.15 Assistant Superintendents are required to help the Centre Superintendent in the distribution of question papers and answer sheets etc. among the examinees and in collecting back the answer sheets from the candidates at the termination of examination and perform such other duties as may be assigned to them by the Centre Superintendent.

5.29.16 If, any candidate is found resorting to use of unfair means in the examination or involved in creating disturbance or acting in a manner so as to cause inconvenience to other candidates, the Assistant Superintendent shall, at once, report the matter to the Superintendent.

5.30 Appointment of Centre Superintendents and Assistant Centre Superintendents

The Center Superintendent/Deputy Superintendent/Assistant Superintendent /Invigilators shall be appointed by the Controller of Examinations as per the need of the examination as per in rules and regulations.

5.31 Creation of Examination Centers

5.31.1 The examinations shall ordinarily be held at such center as may be created in the premises/ Faculty/Departments/Schools of the University.

5.31.2 For all India Entrance Test, if any, the centers at places other than the premises of the University/Faculties/Department/ Schools may be created by the University as per governing regulations.

5.32 Special arrangements for Amanuensis (Writer for Answers)

5.32.1 A candidate may be allowed the help of an amanuensis (Writer) if:

(a) He/she is blind;

OR

(b) He/she is permanently disabled for writing with his/her own hand;

OR

(c) He/she is temporary disabled for writing, such as fracture of the right or left arm, fore-arm or dislocation of a shoulder, elbow or wrist, etc. the candidate shall produce a certificate from a Professor/Director of the specialty concerned of a Medical College/Institution and where

there is no Medical College/Institution, from the Civil Surgeon of the District concerned, to the effect that the candidate is unable to write his/her answer books because of the temporary disablement.

5.32.2 On the written request from the blind candidate(s) through the Head of the teaching Department/Director/Principal/Dean of the constituent School, the Controller of Examinations is authorized to appoint amanuensis in accordance with the prescribed qualifications of the writer. Intimation with full particulars on the prescribed Performa will be sent to the University by Superintendent-in-Chief in the last packet. In case of other handicapped persons amanuensis will be appointed with the approval of the Vice Chancellor.

5.32.3 In case a person's Physical handicap is such as to render him/her incapable of answering the paper in the prescribed time, an extra time up to one hour for a paper may be allowed to blind person.

5.32.4 The amanuensis shall be two grades lower in education than the candidate, but he/she must not have secured more than 60% marks in the Examination. The requirement of having obtained not more than 60% marks in the last examination may be relaxed if the qualification of the writer is more than two grades lower than that of the examinee.

Provided further that in case of blind candidate, amanuensis shall be of one grade lower in education than the examinee but he/she must have not secured more than 60% marks in the examination.

5.32.5 The Superintendent shall arrange for a suitable room for the disabled candidate and put on duty one additional assistant Superintendent for him/her out of the list supplied by the University Office.

5.32.6 The candidate other than blind person asking for writer on genuine medical grounds shall pay in advance to the University an additional prescribed fee per paper. No payment shall be made to the writer by the University which will be the responsibility of the examinee himself/herself.

5.33 Punishment for use of unfair means

(i) Before the examination begins the Centre Superintendent or the Deputy Superintendent of the Examination Centre shall call upon all the candidates to deliver to him all papers, books or notes which they may have in their possession. He shall also warn the candidates that if any of them fails to do so, he shall be liable to penalty. Where all late comer is admitted, this warning shall be given to him at the gate.

(ii) The Center Superintendent or the examiner in case of Sub-Clause-4(g) shall forward to the Registrar/Controller of Examinations on each day of the examination a declaration signed by him to the effect that the warning as required in Clause-I above was administered.

(iii) The Centre Superintendent shall take action against an examinee who is found using or attempting to use unfair means as defined in Caluse-4 below, in the examination hall or within the premises of the examination center.

(iv) Use of unfair means shall include the following:

- a) Having in his possession or accessible to him during examination hours any papers, books or notes, written or printed or any kind of material including body, clothing etc.
- b) Writing during the examination hours on any material (including the question paper or blotting paper) other than the answer-book.
- c) Talking to another candidate or to any person other than the members of the supervisory staff in or outside the Examination Hall during the examination hours.
- d) Consulting notes/books in or outside the Examination Hall during examination hours.
- e) Attempting to take or taking help from any notes or hints written on any part of the body or on the clothes worn by the candidate or on the furniture being used by the candidate.
- f) Receiving help from another candidate with or without his concept or giving help to another candidate or receiving help from any other person during examination hours.
- g) Disclosing his identity deliberately or making any distinctive marks in his answer-book for that purpose or making an appeal to the examiner through the answer-book or using abusive or obscene language in the answer-book.
- h) Presenting to the examiner a practical or class-work-note-book which does not belong him.
- i) Communicating or attempting to communicate, directly or through another person with an examiner or with an official of the University with the object of influencing him in the award of marks or making any approach or manipulation for that purpose.
- j) Swallowing/destroying any note, paper etc. found with him during the examination hours.
- k) Making deliberate arrangement to cheat in the examination, such as:
 - (i) Smuggling of an answer-book/continuation sheet in or outside the examination hall or insertion in the answer-book of any sheet(s)
 - (ii) Substitutions, wholly or partly, of an answer-book/continuation sheet by another answer-book/continuation-sheet during or after the examination hours.
 - (iii) Impersonation.
 - (iv) Obtaining admission to the examination on a false representation.
 - (v) Forging another person's signature.
 - (vi) Failing to deliver his answer-book to the person In-charge before leaving the Examination Hall.
 - (vii) Tempering with the particulars, including roll number, written on another candidate's answer-book and/ or writing wrong particulars, including Roll Number on one's own answer book.
- l) Refusing to obey the Centre Superintendent or any other member of the supervisory staff/inspecting staff or creating disturbance of any kind during the examination or otherwise misbehaving in or around the examination hall or threatening or assaulting any official connected with the examination, any time during, before or after the examination.

- m) Any other act of unfair-means/misconduct not covered in these provisions.
- (v) If a candidate is found to be or suspected to be guilty of using unfair means in the examination, the Superintendent may take away his answer-book and permit him, if he so desires, to answer the remaining part of the question-paper on a new answer-book which shall be supplied to him on demand. The candidate may also appear in the rest of the examination in the subsequent papers at his own risk and subject to the decision the University may take in his case for use of unfair-means. The Superintendent may also obtain the explanation of the candidate in writing.
- (vi) The Superintendent of the examination center shall report to the University on the form prescribed by the University, at the earliest, each case where use of unfair-means in the examination had been suspected or discovered with the explanation of the candidate concerned, if any. If the candidate refuses to give any explanation this fact shall be recorded in the report. In case the candidate refuses to part with his answer-book when asked to do so, no new answer-book be given to him and he be asked to leave the examination hall.
- (vii) The Academic Council shall appoint annually one or more Standing Committee(s) to deal with cases of unfair-means in connection with the examinations. At least three members shall form the quorum.
- (viii) Committee shall have the power to:
- Cancel the particular paper or the entire examination in which he has been found guilty of use of unfair means, such cancellation of paper will mean award of zero mark in the paper and cancellation of the entire examination will be treated as failure in the examination.
 - Debar the candidate from appearing in the said examination and/or in any other examination conducted by the University upto a period of three years.
 - The following are the guidelines for the Standing Committee on unfair means cases for award of punishment to the candidates who indulge in unfair-means.

	Nature of Misdemeanor	Punishment
A)	For relevant material found in the candidate's possession concerning the subject and the paper in which the candidate appeared irrespective of the evidence that the material had been used for copying.	Cancellation of the paper or of the entire examination in which the candidate appeared.
B)	For being found with material relevant to the subject of paper with the evidence of copying or attempt at copying.	Cancellation of the entire examination in which the candidate appeared, in addition, the candidate may also be debarred from appearing at the University examination for one year.

C)	For major misdemeanor like smuggling in and out of the answer-books/continuation sheets, impersonation and misconduct etc.	Cancellation of the entire examination in which the candidate appeared, in addition, the debarring him from appearing in the University examination upto three year.
D)	Any other misdemeanor not covered in (a), (b), (c) above.	Cancellation of the entire examination in which the candidate appeared, in addition, the debarring him from appearing in the University examination upto three year.

- (ix) If the committee is unanimous in respect of their decision regarding the guilt of a candidate and regarding the quantum of punishment, its decision shall be final. If there is a difference of opinion amongst the members of the Committee, the matter shall be referred to the Vice-Chancellor whose decision shall be final.
- (x) A candidate who is awarded punishment by the Standing Committee on unfair means on having been found using unfair means may submit an application to the Controller of Examinations for reconsideration of his case within 30 days of the receipt of the decision of the committee along with a fee of Rs. 1000/-. Such reconsideration will be allowed only once.
- (xi) The committee shall consider the reports of the Supervisor/ inspecting staff before arriving at decision. If it considers necessary the committee may take the evidence of any person. In no case the candidate shall be allowed to represent himself by an advocate or any other person.
- (xii) If a candidate appearing in uncleared subject(s) paper(s) of a lower examination alongwith the higher examination is found guilty of use of unfair means in a subject/paper of the lower or the higher examination, either of the examinations or both the examinations (higher and lower) may be cancelled.
- (xiii) In case a candidate denies the allegation(s) against him or if the Committee otherwise thinks it necessary, it shall fix a date, time and place for holding the enquiry and give a notice to the candidate by registered post. Sending such notice by registered post to the candidate at the address given by him in his examination admission application shall be deemed to be a discharge of the University liability as to notice even if the candidate did not receive the letter or that he was not available at the said address. No adjournment of the meeting may be granted to the candidate on any account. On the date and time fixed in the notice which shall not be less than seven days from the date of its dispatch, the Committee shall meet at the required place specified in the said notice for the purpose of holding the enquiry and the said candidate shall be allowed to be present, and heard in the same. The Committee after granting such hearing to the candidate as it may deem necessary, record its finding about the guilt of the candidate.

- (xiv) If any examiner reports any case of use of unfair means which he detected during the course of evaluation of answer-books the same shall also be decided by the Standing Committee after getting the answer-books checked and giving the candidate a reasonable opportunity to defend himself.
- (xv) If unfair means adopted by a candidate come to the notice of the University after the examination, his case will be decided by the unfair-means Committee on such evidence as may be available after giving the candidate a reasonable opportunity to defend himself.
- (xvi) If a candidate is found guilty of unfair-means after his result has been declared the same shall be cancelled beside the candidate being awarded the punishment which would have been awarded to him had fact of use unfair means come to notice before the declaration of his result.
- (xvii) The disqualification under this ordinance will be treated as a failure in the examination and consequences of failure will follow. If a candidate is also disqualified from appearing at the next one or more examinations he shall not be admitted to any course of study, or allowed to appear at any examination of his University, during the period of such disqualification.
- (xviii) If the Vice-Chancellor receives complaints to the effect that the integrity of a University examination has been violated at an examination centre as a consequences of mass copying or other use of unfair means, he, may after enquiry, order re-examination in one or more papers.
- (xix) In this ordinance, the word 'year' means the 'Academic Year' w.e.f. 1st May to 30th April.
- (xx) The record/files of the decided cases shall be disposed of after two years after the period of disqualification.

5.34 PAPER-SETTING AND EVALUATION

General Provisions

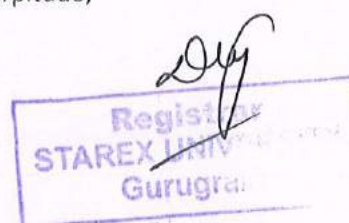
- 5.34.1 Each Board of Studies shall recommend, persons for appointment as Paper-Setters & Examiners for various University Examinations, by the dates notified by the Controller of Examinations, keeping in view the dates of semester/annual examinations.

Provided that the Vice Chancellor may extend the date so notified, in special circumstances.

- 5.34.2 In these provisions:

- (a) An External Examiner shall be one who is not teaching in any department/School/Faculty of this University. He /she shall be a teacher with a requisite qualification and experience in the subject as laid down by the concerned BOS of the course or as per the University regulations working /worked in other than this University.
- (b) An Internal Examiner shall be one who is teaching at this University and is having requisite qualification and experience laid down by the concerned regulating body or by this University, as applicable.

- 5.34.3 The Board of Studies for a subject shall recommend for each examination alternate names for appointment as Paper-Setters as per the guidelines of the concerned regulatory bodies or as may be decided by the University.
- 5.34.4 Notwithstanding anything contained in any other Ordinance for the time being in force, the Vice Chancellor in consultation with the Chairperson of the Board of Studies concerned, shall have the power to remove permanently or for a specified period any Paper-Setter/Examiner if any Faculty/Schools/Department for any examination, if his/her work is found unsatisfactory as to standard of marking or who is found to have committed irregularities or caused inordinate delay in the submission of Awards/Question-paper etc., or there is some doubt with regard to his/her integrity or is otherwise unable to perform the work or to conform to the directions of the university authority/Controller of Examination.
- 5.34.5 Where the appointment of any Paper-Setter/Examiner is cancelled under Clause 5.34.4 above or any Paper-Setter/Examiner is incapable of acting as such or does not accept the appointment in an emergency to meet a particular situation, the Vice Chancellor is empowered to appoint a substitute his/her place as deemed suitable.
- 5.34.6 External Paper-Setters and External Examiners shall be appointed on year to year basis, but no such person will ordinarily continue to act as such for a period of more than three years continuously in the same paper and shall not be eligible for re-appointment unless there is a gap of at least one year.
An Examiner shall be considered to have worked for full one year irrespective of the fact whether his/her appointment was only for the Annual or the Supplementary Examination.
- 5.34.7 No person shall be appointed as Paper-Setter
- (a) If he/she has written or revised a help-book or Guide relating to that paper for use of candidates for the examination concerned.
 - (b) If he/she does possess teaching experience in the subject for:
 - (i) 10 years or
 - (ii) 05 years, in the case of a University Professor/Associate Professor, Provided that this condition may be relaxed by the Vice Chancellor on the recommendation of the Board of Studies in the case of a subject in which qualified teachers are not easily available?
 - (c) If any of his/her relations is appearing in the examination. For this purpose "relation" shall mean- "wife, husband, son, daughter, sister, wife's brother, Brother's son and daughter, sister's son and daughter, first cousin, husband's sister, brother nephew, niece, grandson, grand-daughter, daughter-in-law and son-in law".
 - (d) If he/she:
 - (i) Is convicted of any offence which, in the opinion of the Vice Chancellor, involves moral turpitude;



- (ii) Is declared insane.

If a person has already been appointed and has acquired any of the above disqualification, his/her appointment shall be cancelled.

5.34.8 No person shall be appointed as Examiner if he/she does not have five years teaching experience. However, this condition may be relaxed by the Vice-Chancellor in respect of the subject where the qualified teachers are not available.

5.34.9 Limit on number of papers

- (a) No person may be appointed to set more than two question-papers for examinations during a year. The Annual and the Supplementary examinations for the same paper for one course of study being considered as one. Any exceptions shall need the approval of the Vice Chancellor

This shall not include:

- (i) Setting of Question-Papers for Practical Examination;
(ii) Examining a Thesis/Dissertation; OR
(iii) Professional examination.
(b) A person shall be appointed Paper-Setter/Examiner only for one main examination during a year.

5.34.10 Unless specified otherwise:

- (a) Each paper in Theory shall be set by a single Paper-Setter;
(b) The paper-setter may also act as examiner for evaluating the answer-books. Provided that, where the number of answer-books to be evaluated by the Paper-Setter-cum-Examiner exceeds 300, an additional Examiner(s) may be appointed. The number of answer-books shall be distributed, more or less; equal between among the Paper-Setter-cum-Examiner and the additional examiner(s) wherever felt necessary of the Vice-Chancellor can appoint a Head examiner.

5.34.11 Where a Dissertation/Thesis paper is examined by two Examiners, and the Examiners fail to agree and the difference is not more than 10% of the maximum marks, the average of the two shall be taken as final award. If the unresolved difference between the External and the Internal Examiners is more than 10% of the maximum marks the appointment of a Third Examiner shall be made by the Vice Chancellor, ordinarily on the recommendation of the Head of the Department concerned, whose award shall be treated as final.

5.34.12 The Controller of Examinations shall issue instructions to the Paper-Setter/Examiners with regard to maintaining secrecy and any other matter incidental thereto.

5.34.13 The Paper-Setters shall send the question-papers to the Controller of Examinations in sealed covers before the date to be notified in their appointment letters.

The appointment of a Paper-Setter shall be deemed to be cancelled, if he/she fails to send the question-paper by the date fixed in this behalf, provided that the Controller of Examinations may, for sufficient cause, extend the period.

5.34.14 The Examiners will send the Awards in accordance with the instructions issued in this behalf, by the dates prescribed for the purpose, failing which they will render themselves liable to a deduction from their remuneration at the prescribed rate per day of delay. The Vice Chancellor may, however, for sufficient reason, condone such delay to the extent he/she deems fit.

Deduction in the remuneration of the examiners shall be made on committing mistake/delays as per rules and regulations.

5.35 Evaluation of Answer-Books

5.35.1 The evaluation of answer books shall be done by the Internal/External examiners as per Regulations of the respective Regulating Bodies and as provided in the relevant ordinance of each course. However, the Vice-Chancellor, where deemed necessary, may appoint a moderation committee for each subject/ Paper for sample checking of evaluation of answer books by the examiner so as to avoid erratic/under-evaluation.

5.36 Moderation of Question-Papers

5.36.1 The question-paper set by the Paper-Setters for various University Examinations may, wherever deemed necessary by the Controller of Examinations/Vice Chancellor, be moderated by the Head of the Department concerned. Provided that the Vice Chancellor may also, nominate specialization experts(s) either from within the University or from outside the University to assist the Head of the Department in the moderation of the question-paper(s) or to moderate the question paper singly as the case may be. The External Moderator(s) will be paid remuneration as decided by the University.

Note: The Moderator will see that the question-paper conforms to the syllabus and guidelines. If in a question-paper, it is found by the Moderator that some questions need to be substituted by other questions as a whole, the question-paper shall be sent to the Paper-Setter with the remarks of the Moderator. In case of difference of opinion between the Paper-Setter and the Moderator or if there is not enough time for the question-paper to be referred back to the Paper-Setter, the matter shall be referred to the Vice Chancellor whose decision shall be final.

5.37 Complaints against Question-Papers

5.37.1 Complaints against question-papers shall be entertained only if they are made by and/ or through the Head of constituent School/Department/Faculty of the

University and received by the Controller of Examinations under registered cover or in person, within three days of the examination in that paper. No complaint will be entertained thereafter.

- 5.37.2 A Committee of four persons (including the Controller of Examinations) shall be approved by the Vice Chancellor. This committee shall, within a week of the receipt of the complaint, or as soon as possible, consider and decide, in consultation with the Paper-Setters, if necessary, complaints received.

The decision of the Committee shall be subject to the approval of the Vice Chancellor.

Three members of the Committee will form the quorum.

5.38 Award of Grace Marks

- 5.38.1 Unless specified otherwise in any other Ordinance, Grace Marks may be given to the candidates for various examinations, to the extent and in the manner given below:

A Candidate who fails in one or more paper(s)/subject(s) (Written, Practical, Sessional/Internal Assessment or Viva-Voce) and/or in the Aggregate shall be given Grace Marks up to 1% of the aggregate marks (excluding the marks for Internal Assessment/Sessional(s) of the Paper(s)/Subject(s)) of the examinations, if by the addition of these marks, he/she passes the examination or is placed in compartment/reappear or earn exemption. However, if such a candidate, after ascertaining from the D.M.C./University Exam Branch that he/she has been given grace marks, represents against the Grace Marks awarded to him/her, the same shall be withdrawn and his/her result revised. The option once exercised shall be final. The request of the candidate for withdrawal of Grace Marks must reach the Controller of Examinations within one month of the dispatch of the Detailed-Marks-Card by the University, after which no request will be entertained.

5.39 Issuance of Migration Certificates

- 5.39.1 A candidate, who has passed the final semester/annual examination or a part of examination, may apply for Migration Certificate from the University on the prescribed application form along with a fee of Rs. 1000/-. The Migration Certificate shall be issued by the University as per the guidelines issued from time to time.

5.40 Interpretation of rules

- 5.40.1 Where there is an ambiguity in the rules and the interpretation of the same is required, the decision/interpretation of the Vice-Chancellor shall be final.

The fee may be revised, as necessary, for every new batch on year to year basis and shall be notified as part of the Admission Notice/Admission Brochure for a particular year, before start of admission process.



CHAPTER-6

FEE STRUCTURE

6.1 Fee Structure

- 6.1.1 The University shall, from time to time prepare its fee structure and shall send it for information the Government of Haryana at least 30 days before the commencement of the academic session.
- 6.1.2 No other fee/fund (except Hostel fee) by whatsoever name called shall be payable by a student, other than prescribed in the year of his/her admission.
- 6.1.3 While fixing the fee structure, the University will take due care to ensure that it retains its unaided self-financed status by recovering its actual revenue and capital costs including the interest payable on loans and the fee exemptions and/or concessions granted as per the Act and salaries to the Teaching/Non-Teaching, Technical Staff, infrastructure and reasonable excess expression of University.
- 6.1.4 The University may prescribe a different fee structure for each course, for Resident Indian Students and for children/wards of Non Resident Indians or Foreign Students.

6.2 Mode of Payment

- 6.2.1 Fee shall be paid in cash or by Demand Draft/Cheque (subject to realization)/Bank Transfer/Internet Banking or any other method approved by the Board of Management, made in favour of Starex University, payable at Gurugram.
- 6.2.2 Fee paid by a student is not refundable under any circumstances in part or whole after commencement of the academic session.
- 6.2.3 Student must obtain a receipt for every payment made to the University. Fees shall only be paid at the Accounts Office of the University, or by using the method prescribed by the University for Bank Transfer/Internet Banking or any other method approved by the Board of Management.
- 6.2.4 Fee shall not be paid in part or in installment, unless specified by the University.
- 6.2.5 Delayed payments will attract late fee and/or interest as may be prescribed from time to time.
- 6.2.6 Cheques returned unpaid for any reason shall attract an administrative fee, and collection fee as may be prescribed from time to time.

6.3 Fee Payable

- 6.3.1 The fee shall be payable under the following heads which are subject to change from time to time to time as per prevailing rules and regulations as applicable at that time for different courses.
 - (a) Admission Fee

- (b) Tuition Fee
- (c) Medical Fee
- (d) Internal Examination Charges
- (e) Socio-Culture Fee/CME/Seminar
- (f) Internet/Computer Fee
- (g) Sports/Gymnasium Charges
- (h) Registration Fee/Processing /Software Charges
- (i) Continuation Fee/Charges
- (j) Library Charges
- (k) Research & Consumable Charges
- (l) Practical Charges
- (m) Refundable Security
- (n) Hostel Charges Dissertation/Thesis Charges
- (o) Enrolment Charges
- (p) Examination Fee
- (q) Other Charges

6.3.2 Refundable Security shall be refunded in full, without interest, on production of security deposit receipt and "No Dues Certificate" from concerned departments/Offices, when such a refund becomes due. However, costs for any damage or loss caused by the student, or any outstanding dues or fines that remain unpaid are liable to be deducted from the refundable security deposit before refund.

6.4 Fee Structure Notification and Revisions

- 6.4.1 Fee Structure shall be notified as part of the Admission Notice/Admission Brochure for a particular year before start of admission process.
- 6.4.2 The fee and fee Structure may be revised, as necessary, for every new batch on year to year basis.
- 6.4.3 The Fee Committee of the University shall prepare the fee structure and review the same periodically in the light of Section-8 of The Haryana Private University Act, 2006, as amended upto date, which mandates that the University shall be self-financed and shall not be entitled to receive any grant or financial assistance from the Government or any Board or Corporation owned or controlled by the Government. The recommendation of the fee committee will be considered by the Finance Committee and submitted to the Board of Management for approval. Fee structure so approved shall be notified.

CHAPTER – 7

HOSTEL/STUDENT RESIDENCES

7.1 The University shall provide convenient & suitable residential accommodation to its students (boys and girls separately) desirous of having hostel accommodation on a shared basis.

7.2 General

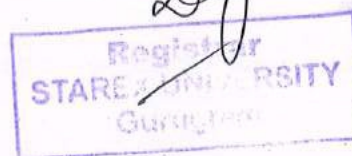
- (i) All the hostel rooms shall be furnished with beds, study tables, chair and cupboards and equipped with ceiling fans and light. Special facilities for air conditioning on extra payment basis shall also be provided. The students who are interested in installing air conditioners will have to apply for the same and then have the air – conditioners installed and pay the actual electricity cost/charges. Besides, for all its residents, the Hostel shall consist of a common dining hall, a common recreation room with a T.V, incoming call facility and common bathrooms etc. Geysers shall be provided in all bathrooms.
 - (ii) Being a fully self-financed, unaided University, the hostels shall not be subsidized by the University in any manner. It shall be run as a self-financed hostel by recovering all actual costs of running and maintaining the said hostel and mess, including its rent. The actual cost is to be recovered equitably from all students occupying the hostel, under the overall management of the University.
 - (iii) If it is found at any point, even after the hostel has been occupied, that all the actual costs of running and maintaining the said hostel are not being remitted, the University reserves the right to recover the actual cost equitably from all the residents.
 - (iv) Hostel accommodation shall be given for one year at a time commencing from the start of Academic Year.
 - (v) Accommodation in the hostel cannot be claimed as a matter of right by any student. All students enrolled with the University as regular students, except ex-students, are entitled to apply and may be considered for hostel accommodation.
- N.B-** The above rules are subject to revision and may further be supplemented by separate provisions.

7.3 Admission

Students seeking admission to the hostels must apply separately on the prescribed form to the Chief Warden, Starex University Gurgaon at the beginning of every academic year. The dates for the same shall be put on the notice board of the hostel. The In charge, admission then shall send the filled forms to the Dean Students Welfare. The decision of the Dean Students' Welfare shall be final and binding. Once the decision is taken, the list of selected students shall be displayed on the Notice Board of the Hostel. On deposition of the hostel fee with the Accounts Section, a list of names with receipt of payment shall be sent to Hostel In-charge/Warden.

7.4 Attendance, Leave and Conduct

- (a) All the residents are to be in their rooms by the time fixed by the Warden. Those who are out after the fixed time will be marked absent. Hostel residents shall show their Identity Card if so required by any officer of the University Warden at any time.
- (b) Hostel residents are required to take permission/leave for leaving the hostel. On working days, no leave from the hostel will be granted unless the student has obtained written permission from the Head of Department (H.O.D)/Dean/Principal.
- (c) All application must contain the details of the student. i.e. student's name, roll number, Hostel Block, Rooms/Dormitory Number, and date.
- (d) Coming late from an outing or absenting for the night will be considered a serious act & on repeating the act three times, the prescribed fine shall be lived.
- (e) In case of any emergency e.g. sudden illness, death in the family or serious accident, etc, Permission will be granted immediately.
- (g) In case a room-mate is absent after 10:00 PM without leave/permission of absence, and without message, the matter shall be reported immediately by the other room- mate to the Warden or a Senior Staff member in the campus. If any student is found missing from the room during a spot check up at night, the Warden will hold the room-mate responsible for not reporting the absence.
- (h) Student involved in any brawl/fight will attract serious disciplinary action. Such cases are to be brought to the notice of the authorities immediately. In case of any brawl/flight or any assault and attempt to Assault, the offender will be handed over to police and expelled from the hostel immediately.
- (i) Hostel residents need advance permission for any celebration (of birthday etc.) which would be normally permitted only up to 9:00PM.
- (j) Student s are allowed to play music in their rooms only till 10 PM. Playing loud music is not permitted at any time.
- (k) Students are not permitted to change their rooms without permission of the hostel warden.
- (l) If lights, fans and air conditioners are not switched off when no one is in the room, a fine will be assessed and all the occupants will be liable to pay fine.
- (m) Students are not expected to shout, scream or make any noise that may disturb other students.
- (n) Cooking and Eating in the room is not permitted. Use of electrical appliances like heater, heating rods etc. is not permitted. In case of default, offender's appliances may be confiscated and a fine may be imposed.
- (o) All Students must inform the officer in charge when going to home on leave, alongwith a contact/telephone number and address.



7.5 Damage to Furniture, Fixtures and Appliances etc.

Student shall be liable to pay the prescribed cost for making good the damage or replace the Furniture, Fixtures and Appliances equipment (s) damaged as per the rates prescribed under hostel rules and regulations. In case of willful damage, a fine up to rupees five thousand may be imposed on the student in addition to the recovery of costs.

7.6 Meats

- (a) All students are expected to take their meals in the Mess. Strict timings is to be observed as notified.
- (b) In case of illness, meals can be served in the room on the recommendation of the Medical Office/Doctor in-charge of the case.
- (c) All students must be dressed properly. Students are not allowed in the shorts or similar attire in campus/Mess. Silence shall be observed while taking food in and around the Study hall areas.
- (d) Since food is served in buffet style, therefore, wastage in any form must be avoided at all cost.

7.7 Guests

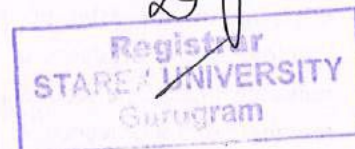
- (a) No visitors will be allowed to visit the students without written permission from the parents.
- (b) Parents & Guardians are allowed to visit their wards in the Visitors Room only. The prescribed visiting hours on week days is from 07:00 am to 8.00 am and again from 3.00 pm to 7.00 pm. On Sundays & Holidays visiting hours are from 08:00 am to 09:00 pm or as may be notified from time to time.

7.8 Discipline

- (a) Residents are expected to conduct themselves with dignity and should not disturb any other residents by screaming and rushing around the corridors. Playing of loud music is also forbidden. The T.V. volume must be controlled by the person handling the remote.
- (b) To maintain peace, no religious ceremonies or parties should be held in the hostel.
- (c) Lights and taps should be shut off when not in the room. Tea leaves or garbage must not be flushed down the drain. Dustbins have been provided on all floors.
- (d) Residents are not allowed to use any electrical appliances such as heaters, rods, iron or any high voltage equipment's in the rooms. A fine will be charged & the appliance confiscated.
- (e) Boarders are advised not to keep any jewellery or excess cash to avoid theft. They must lock their room's even if out for a short duration. No one will be held responsible for nay loss or damage to the valuables.

- (f) The hostel authorities may expel any boarder at any time if not satisfied with the student's conduct.
- (g) Use of abusive language, gambling, consuming drugs or any form of alcoholic drinks is strictly prohibited within or outside the Hostel. Those who are involved will be expelled from the hostel immediately and or fired suitably.
- (h) Any complaints must be brought to the notice of the Warden/Hostel in charge.
- (i) Guests are not permitted to stay overnight in the campus. Hostel is to be treated as one's home. It is to be kept clean at all times.
- (j) Any damage to the T.V. set, furniture or fixtures will have to be replaced or paid for by the concerned student(s)/defaulters.
- (k) T.V. will be allowed to be viewed watched and on till 10:30 PM, Weekends till 11:30 PM.
- (l) Hostel rules may be changed from time to time & hostlers will be notified.
- (m) Any breach of Hostel rules shall invite an enquiry and if the student(s) is are found guilty, then the Hostel Committee shall or advice disciplinary action as deemed fit, depending on the case, including expulsion from the hostel.
- (n) The Hostels Rules are subject to change from time to time with the approval of the prescribed Authority.

N.B:- The above rules/regulation may further be supplemented by separate provisions as notified from time to time.



CHAPTER-8

CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINARY PROVISIONS

8.1 Title of Rules

These provisions shall be called Starex University Students Conduct and Disciplinary Provisions.

8.2 Date of Commencement

These Rules shall come into force with immediate effect on the publication of ordinance in the Official Gazette.

8.3 Application of Rules

These Rules shall apply to all the students of the University, whether admitted before the date of enforcement of these rules or afterwards.

8.4 Acts of Indiscipline and Misconduct

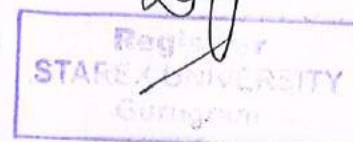
Any act of misconduct committed by a student inside or outside the campus shall be 47 an act of violation of discipline of the University. Without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing provision, violation of the discipline among other things shall include:

- (i) Disruption of teaching, student examination, research or administrative work, curricular or extra-curricular activity or residential life of the members of the University, including any attempt to prevent any member of the University or its staff from carrying on his or her work; and any act reasonably likely to cause such disruption.
- (ii) Damaging or defacing University property or the property of members of the University or any other property inside or outside the University campus.
- (iii) Engaging in any attempt at wrongful confinement of teachers, offices, employees and students of the University or camping inside or creating nuisance inside the boundaries of houses of teachers, officers and other members of the University.
- (iv) Use of abusive and derogatory slogans or intimidator language or incitement of hatred and violence or any act calculated to further the same.
- (v) Ragging in any form. "The word 'ragging' means the action of teasing, playing a practical joke upon someone or holding comic parades and other activities during certain period of a College term to raise money for charity".

Ragging includes Display of noisy, disorderly conduct, teasing excitement by rough or rude treatment or handling, including in rowdy undisciplined activities which causes or likely to cause annoyance undue hardship, physical or psychological harm or raise apprehension or fear in a fresher or asking the students to do any act or perform something which cause him/her shame or embarrassment or danger to his/her life. Forms of ragging to address senior or 'Sir' perform mass drills; copy class notes for the seniors; sever various errands; do menial jobs for the seniors; asks/answer vulgar questions; force to look at pornographic pictures to fresher out of their innocence; force to drink alcohol,

scalding tea, etc. to do acts which can lead to physical injury, mental torture or death; strip kiss or do other obscenities.

- (vi) Eve teasing or disrespectful behavior to women or girls students.
- (vii) An assault upon, or intimidation of or insulting behavior towards a teacher, officer, employee or student or any other person.
- (viii) Causing or colluding in the unauthorized entry of any person into the campus or in the unauthorized occupation of any portion of University premises, including hostels or halls of residence by any person;
- (ix) Getting enrolled in more than once course of study simultaneously in violation of the University rules;
- (x) Committing forgery, tampering with or misuse of the University documents or records, identification cards. Etc.
- (xi) Furnishing false certificate or false information to any office under the control and jurisdiction of the University;
- (xii) Consuming or possessing alcoholic drinks, dangerous drugs, tobacco or other intoxicants in the University premises.
- (xiii) Indulging in acts of gambling in the University premises, loitering.
- (xiv) Possession or using any weapons such as knives, Lathis, iron chains, iron rods, sticks, explosives and fire arms in the University premises.
- (xv) Arousing communal, caste or regional feelings or creating disharmony among students;
- (xvi) Not disclosing one's identity, or not showing University identity card, when asked to do so by an employees or officer of the University who is authorized to do so.
- (xvii) Tearing of pages, defacing, burning and destroying of books of any library or seminar.
- (xviii) Unauthorized occupation of hostel, rooms or unauthorized acquisition or use or University furniture in one's hostel room or elsewhere.
- (xix) Accommodating guests or other persons in hostels without permission of the Provost or Warden.
- (xx) Improper rendering of accounts for money drawn from or through any office under the control and jurisdiction of the University.
- (xxi) Coercing the Medical Staff to render Medical Assistance to persons not entitled to the same or any other disorderly behavior.
- (xxii) Any act of moral turpitude;
- (xxiii) Any offence under Law.
- (xxiv) Committing any of the offences specified in the examination (Control of Unfair Means and Disorderly Conduct) Regulations of the University.
- (xxv) Violation of the Traffic Rules as notified by the Proctor.
- (xxvi) Improper behavior while on tour or excursion.
- (xxvii) Pasting of posters or distributing pamphlets, handbills etc. of an objectionable nature or writing on walls and disfiguring buildings.



- (xxviii) Disobeying the teachers and displaying misdemeanor within and outside the University premises, and/or not wearing prescribed uniform/aprons/laboratory coats/safety glasses etc.
- (xxix) Indulging in vandalism/violence and damaging University and /or Public property or property of any other person.
- (xxx) Demonstrations, inciting protests, distributing hand bills etc.
- (xxxi) Unauthorized use of mobile/satellite phone within the campus
- (xxxii) Any type of harassment whether physical, verbal, mental, sexual or electronics.
- (xxxiii) Quarrelling, fighting and passing derogatory remarks in the University premises against fellow students/Teachers/employees/canteen and mess workers etc. and
- (xxxiv) Any other act which may be considered by the Vice Chancellor or the Discipline Committee to be an act of violation of Discipline.

8.5 Officers authorized to take disciplinary action

Without prejudice to the powers of the Vice Chancellor as specified and under the Statutes, the following persons are authorized to take disciplinary action in the respective field by way of imposing penalties as specified in these Rules:

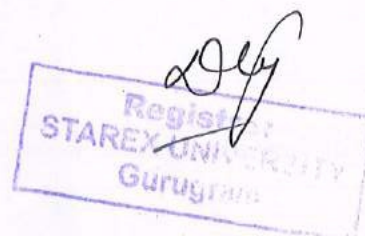
- (i) Dean of the Concerned Faculties
- (ii) Dean Student's Welfare
- (iii) Head of the Concerned Department.
- (iv) Proctor
- (v) Librarian, University Library
- (vi) Provosts/Wardens of Halls of Residence and Hostels
- (vii) Incharge, University Games Committee, if any.
- (viii) Any other person employed by the University and authorized by the Vice Chancellor for the purpose.

8.6 Imposition of Penalties

- (i) Any penalty enumerated in Rule 8.7 may be imposed by the Vice Chancellor upon the recommendation of the Disciplinary Committee constituted under the Ordinance.
- (ii) Penalties other than those specified in Clause (ix), (x), (xi), (xii) and (xiii) of Rule 8.7 may also be imposed by any of the Officers enumerated in Rule 8.5 within their respective jurisdictions.
- (iii) Penalties for the offences relating to Examinations will be dealt by the relevant bodies.

8.7 Nature of Penalties

The following penalties may, for the act(s) of indiscipline or misconduct on for sufficient reasons, be imposed on a student, namely:



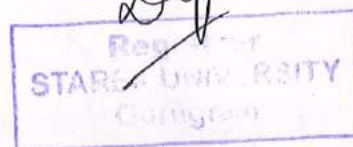
- (i) Written warning under information to the guardian with a copy to be placed in the dossier of the student.
- (ii) A fine of Rs. 500/- which may be extended up to Rs. 5,000/-.
- (iii) Suspension from the Class/Department/School/Faculty for the specified period with effect on attendance, suspension from Hostel/Mess/Library and/or withdrawal of any academic or other University activity, privilege, benefit, right or facility.
- (iv) Suspension or withdrawal of Scholarships, fellowships or any financial assistance from any source or recommendation to that effect to the sanctioning agency.
- (v) Recovery of pecuniary loss caused to University Property.
- (vi) Debarring from participation in Sports/NCC/NSS and other such activities.
- (vii) Disqualification from holding any representative position in the Class/ College/ Hostel/ Mess/ Sports/Clubs and in similar other bodies.
- (viii) Hostel Shifting.
- (ix) Sent down, Deduction from General Proficiency Marks; debar from all or certain number of Campus Placements.
- (x) Expulsion from the Department/Faculty/Hostel/Mess/Library/Club for a specified period
- (xi) Debarring from an examination;
- (xii) With holding the Migration Certificate for the Special period.
- (xiii) Expulsion from the University for a specified period or permanently.
- (xiv) Disqualification from further studies, or prohibition of further admission or re-admission.

8.8 Suspension Pending Enquiry

Any student against whom a charge of misconduct has been made may be suspended from the rolls of the University by the Vice-Chancellor, pending enquiry or pending trial of a cognizable offence by a court of law.

8.9 Conduct

- (a) Every student in the University shall at all times display good behavior, show diligence in studies, maintain decorum and dignity, take due interest in co-curricular activities, observe a code of conduct both within and outside the campus in a manner befitting to the student of a University of national stature and observe all the rules of discipline of the University.
- (b) Each student shall show due respect and courtesy to the teachers, administrators, and other employees in and outside the University and towards the fellow students including residents of the hostel and residents of surrounding areas and villages.
- (c) Any violation of code of conduct or breach of any rule or regulation of the University by a student shall constitute an act of indiscipline and shall make



him/her liable for disciplinary action which will be taken by the duly constituted Disciplinary Committee.

8.10 Composition of Disciplinary Committee

The Disciplinary committee consisting of the following will be responsible for maintaining discipline among students.

- (a) Dean Students Welfare (Convener)
- (b) Proctor, if any
- (c) Two teachers appointed by the Vice-Chancellor
- (d) Chief Security Officer of the University
- (e) The Registrar

The term of office of members of the Students Disciplinary Committee shall be one year.

8.11 Procedure for Punishment

If a student is found indulging in any breach of discipline, misconduct, unruly behavior, provocation, instigation, harassment, idleness, any faculty or staff or student can report the matter in writing or verbally to Disciplinary Committee of the University for appropriate Action.

- (a) **Receipt of Complaint:** A disciplinary case will be initiated when an action indicating indiscipline is noticed by any authority or reported by any complainant (Faculty/Staff/Students) to the Chairman Disciplinary Committee (CDC). The complaint shall be reduced in writing. Depending on the gravity of the offence, if the CDC is convinced that prima facie evidence exists against the defaulter, the CDC can suspend the student pending investigation.

- (b) **Investigation:**

Minor Cases: The CDC will issue a Show Cause Notice to the defaulter based on the facts of the case within 24 hours of the complaint. After having the matter investigated, the defaulter having been given an opportunity to be heard, a warning will be issued to the defaulter if he/she is found guilty. If a written apology is submitted by the defaulter, it shall be filed in the student record held with the Warden/Registrar. The CDC may close a case on receipt of such a written apology by the defaulter and his/her parents. If any detailed inquiry is required, the CDC may constitute an inquiry committee consisting of one or more members of the Discipline Committee, to conduct a detailed inquiry into the matter.

Serious Cases: In serious cases, a Show Cause Notice will be issued to the defaulter, giving brief details of the incident. The reply by the defaulter needs to submit to the CDC by hand within 24 hours. If the CDC is not satisfied with the reply, he will issue a letter to the defaulter, to appear before the Disciplinary Committee. (if necessary, along with his/her parents) on a specified date/time. A copy of this letter will be

placed on the table of the Disciplinary Committee. The Disciplinary Committee will award punishment after giving the defaulter an opportunity to be heard.

(c) Disciplinary Committee Meeting

- (i) Presence of a minimum of three members is mandatory for Disciplinary Committee meeting to be held.
- (ii) Disciplinary Committee will generally meet once a month or on the date/time specified by the Chairman as and when required. The Committee shall decide the punishment within two days and issue the punishment award letter where defaulter has been found guilty. The award of punishment will also be put up on the Discipline Notice Board which may include a photograph of the defaulter.
- (iii) Copies of punishment award shall be placed in the registration record of the student and will also be sent to the Vice Chancellor, Dean (Academics), Department concerned, Registrar, Deputy Registrar, and Training and Placement Officer as required.

8.12 Community Service


At sole discretion of Discipline Committee, the defaulter can be given depending on merits of the case an option to undertake University Community Service, such as work at Library, Records, and Security. Administration, Sports, Editorial work.

8.13 Appeals

Appeals, if any shall lie with the Vice Chancellor whose decision in the matter shall be final. Only those cases will merit review by the Vice Chancellor where any new information or evidence is produced by the defaulter, other than what has already been considered by the Disciplinary Committee.

8.14 Amendments and Repeal

The Starex University Students Conduct and Disciplinary provisions may be amended or repealed with the approval of the competent authorities from time to time.

CHAPTER-9

COOPERATION AND COLLABORATION WITH OTHER UNIVERSITIES AND INSTITUTIONS, TRANSFER AND ARTICULATION

9.1 Cooperation and Collaboration

The University may seek cooperation and collaboration with Universities and Institutions/Organization of Higher Education in India and abroad and may execute a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) and/or Transfer and Articulation Agreements where necessary detailing the extent and areas of cooperation, as mutually agreed upon.

9.2 The University may enter into cooperation and collaboration agreements with international institutions of high academic standards in the areas of mutual interest. Such cooperation may include:

- (a) Students exchange programmes.
- (b) Faculty exchange programmes.
- (c) Twinning programmes for practical and training programmes only.
- (d) Joint Research programmes.
- (e) Exchange of data, documentation and research material and any other cooperation in the fields of Mutual interest.

9.3 The area of cooperation and collaboration may also include curriculum design, industrial training, project work, research, consultancy and dissemination of knowledge. Summer internships, placements etc.

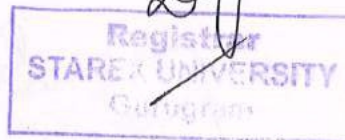
9.4 The University may enter into cooperation and collaboration agreements organizations, research institutions and industries, both Government and Private, in the areas of research, teaching, training, and internship summer placements, employment for the students, and for training teachers of various faculties departments and to organize conferences/seminars and workshops in collaboration with them.

9.5 The scope of co-operation may be reviewed from time to time and may be amended as required with the approval of the prescribed Authority.

9.6 Transfer and Articulation Committee

9.6.1 The University shall form a Transfer and Articulation committee which will look after the students transfer, course equivalency, articulation and related issues. The transfer and Articulation committee shall consist of three members from Deans or Professors of the University Deputy Registrar Academic shall be its Member Secretary. All the members of the Committee other than ex-officio members shall hold office for a term of three years. The committee members shall be nominated, removed or replaced by the Vice Chancellor. The Committee shall have the following powers and functions:

- (a) To consider proposals for transfer and articulation agreements with other Indian and Foreign Universities as may be required from time to time and recommend the same, if found fit.
 - (b) To consider proposals, and to recommend Student or Faculty Exchange Programmes with other Indian and Foreign Universities.
 - (c) To ascertain and fix equivalency of different courses being taught in Starex University with courses and programmes of other Indian and Foreign Universities.
 - (d) To ascertain, fix and award credits to students who have completed courses and programmes from other Indian and Foreign Universities where no equivalency of course programmes has yet been fixed and with whom no transfer and articulation agreement has been signed.
 - (e) To research and maintain information on accreditation status of foreign universities and the valuation and equivalence of degree and diplomas awarded by the accredited universities abroad.
- 9.6.2 The Committee shall send its recommendations to the Vice Chancellor who shall be the accepting authority for its recommendations.
- 9.6.3 The Committees shall endeavor to ensure that all policies and procedures relating to transfer and articulation are easily understood, readily available, and widely distributed among students, faculty, and staff, and that the transfer process is efficient, predictable, and sensitive to student needs and treats both native and transfer students equitably.
- 9.6.4 The University will adopt and maintain a clear and concise Credit Transfer Policy in consultation with the Committee, and its Departments/Faculties.

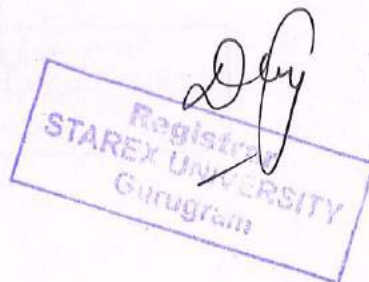


CHAPTER-10

CREATION, COMPOSITION & FUNCTIONS OF ANY OTHER BODY FOR IMPROVING ACADEMIC LIFE

10 Other Bodies

- 10.1 The university may establish campus development committee, faculty club, community club, etc. for the development of campus and for creating congenial environment on the campus. The constitution and functions of these bodies will be prescribed in the regulations.



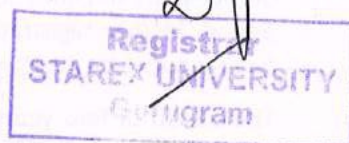
CHAPTER-11

COURSE CREDIT AND GRADING SYSTEM

11 Letter Grade Evaluation Scheme, Course Credit and Grading

- 11.1 The evaluation scheme in respect of the courses where the Course Credit and Letter Grading System is made applicable shall be prescribed in the relevant course ordinances. The grade awarded to the student in a course should reflect student's proficiency in the course. It will be based on the performance of the students in Minor Test, assignment, Viva-Voce, Lab-work, Seminar, Workshop presentation and group discussions etc. whichever is applicable as per scheme, in addition to the Mid Term and Final Examination and practical exam, if applicable, at the end of Semester/Term.

The letter grading scheme, Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA), Cumulative Grade point Average (CGPA) based evaluation, course credit and grading scheme may be prescribed by the Academic Council with the approval of the Board of Management.



- (e) The examination shall be held at the end of the semester for course work which shall be necessary to qualify by the candidate to proceed further. The course work must be completed within one year of admission. However, if at the end of second semester the student fails to meet the minimum qualifying requirements for proceeding further with the writing of the dissertation/thesis the candidate will be asked to take more courses in order to meet the requirements, for which an extension of one semester for completion of course work may be granted at the request of the research scholar to the Dean (Academics). Such a request for extension must be recommended by the supervisor(s) and Department Research Committee (DRC) and routed through the Chairman, Department Research Committee (DRC).
- (f) If after such an extension the student fails to meet the minimum qualifying requirements for proceeding further with the writing of dissertation/thesis he/she will have to discontinue the Department programme.
- (g) If found necessary, the course work may be carried out by the Departmental student in sister faculties/departments/Schools either within or outside the University for which due credit will be given to them as may be prescribed in regulations. For this, the student shall seek permission of the dean (Academics). Such a request for permission to attend courses outside the University and transfer of credit must be recommended by the supervisor(s) and Department Research Committee (DRC) and routed through the Chairman, Department Research Committee (DRC). For such a course work carried out within the University, the permission of the Supervisor and respective Head of the Departments/Faculties shall be sufficient.

12.16 Research Proposal Plan

- (a) Upon satisfactory completion of course work and research methodology, the M.Phil/Ph.D scholar shall undertake research work and produce synopsis or a "Research Proposal" on the selected research area of his/her interest in consultation with his/her supervisor, within six months. The objective of the proposal is for the student to define the M.Phil/Ph.D research field based on a review and critical analysis of the literature.
- (b) The research scholar shall present the proposed work in an open seminar and defend it before the Department Research committee (DRC). The Department Research Committee (DRC) may approve the proposal, suggest modifications, or reject the proposal. If the proposal is approved, the Department Research Committee (DRC) shall communicate its recommendations to the dean (Academics) for further processing through Board of Studies. In case the proposal needs modifications, the Department Research Committee (DRC) will ask the candidate to resubmit a revised proposal within a specified time (next 3 months). In case DRC does not find the Proposal suitable, it can reject the proposal and communicate to the candidate about the decision and allow him to submit fresh research proposal within the next six months in consultation with his/her supervisor.

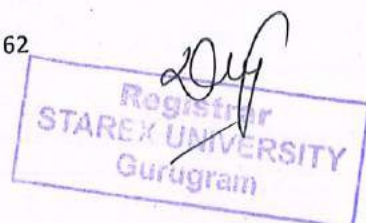
12.17 Progress of the Research Work

- (a) If a supervisor is not satisfied with the work of the candidate, he/she will inform the Department Research Committee (DRC) for appropriate advice to the scholar. The Department Research committee (DRC) may take up the matter with the Dean (Academics). The matter will be considered by the Dean (Academic), in order to decide whether the candidate should be allowed to continue his/her research for the Ph.D. degree.
- (b) A research scholar may request the Dean (Academic) for discontinuation of his/her research work through his/her supervisor/Department Research Committee (DRC).
- (c) All correspondence will be made by the Scholar through the supervisor(s) and Head of the Department/Faculty/School except in very exceptional circumstances.

12.18 Submission of Synopsis

- (a) On completion of the research work to the satisfaction of the supervisor(s), the scholar will submit 10 copies of the synopsis to the Department Research Committee (DRC) through the supervisor. The synopsis must precisely reflect all aspects for the research work done which are to be included in the thesis. A CD containing a PDF file of the synopsis shall also be submitted.
- (b) The Supervisor shall forward the synopsis to the Department Research Committee (DRC) for assessment. The assessment shall be carried out by the DRC through a pre-M.Phil/Ph.D presentation. The presentation may be open to all faculty members and research students, at the discretion of Department Research Committee (DRC), which may be suitably incorporated into the draft thesis under the advice of the supervisor(s).
- (c) Ph.D. candidate shall publish at least one research paper in a referred Journal before the submission of the thesis/monograph for adjudication, and produce evidence for the same in the form of acceptance letter or the reprint.
- (d) The thesis must be a piece of original research work characterized either by the discovery of new facts or by fresh interpretation of the known facts or theories. In either case, it shall give evidence of the candidate's capacity for original research, critical examination and judgment.
- (e) Plagiarism shall be dealt according to the regulations of the University.
- (f) The scholar shall submit six (6) printed or typed copies, duly bound of his/her thesis to the Department Research Committee (DRC) through his/her supervisor, who shall forward the thesis for acceptance to the Dean (Academic) for further processing. In addition, a CD of the thesis in PDF format shall also be submitted by the scholar for forwarding it to the Dean (Academics).
- (g) The thesis shall include the following certificate signed by the supervisor(s):

"This is to Certify that the thesis entitled "..... (Title of the Thesis)" submitted to Starex University in partial fulfillment of the



requirements for the award of degree of Doctor of Philosophy in
(name of the subject) embodies the original research work carried out by
Mr./Ms. (Name of the candidate) under my/our supervision
and has not been submitted in part or full for any other degree or diploma of
the University or of any other university/institution anywhere".

12.20 Appointment of Examiners

- (a) The thesis submitted by the M.Phil/Ph.D student shall be evaluated by at least two experts, out of which at least one shall be from outside the State. The University may, in its sole discretion, have one examiner from outside the country.
- (b) From the panel of examiners submitted by the Chairman, Board of Studies the Dean (Academics) will appoint two external examiners after taking approval of the Vice Chancellor. These two external examiners and the supervisor(s) of the scholar shall form the Committee of Examiners for evaluation of thesis submitted by the research scholar. This Committee shall be notified by the Dean (Academics). The appointment of these examiners shall be strictly confidential.
- (c) The Dean shall request the appointed examiner to give his/her consent for the acceptance of examiner ship enclosing a copy of synopsis for their perusal. In case, an appointed external examiner declines to act an examiner, the Dean (Academics) may appoint another external examiner from the panel.

12.21 Evaluation of Thesis by Examiners

- (a) On receipt of acceptance of examiner ship from the appointed two examiners/experts, out of which one should be from outside the State, a copy of the thesis shall be sent to them for evaluation within a stipulated time indicated by the Dean (Academics).
- (b) Each Examiner is required to give his/her assessment report and a clear recommendation about the candidate's research work to the Dean (Academics).

The assessment report shall cover the following in details:

- (i) Significant contribution to knowledge.
- (ii) Any specific observation made requiring revision, modification or clarification by the candidate.
- (iii) Standard of presentation of thesis.

The recommendation made by the examiner about the candidate's research work shall be on the prescribed form provided by Starex University indicating clearly ONE of the following:

a	The thesis is recommended for the award of the Ph.D. Degree in the present form	Yes/NO
B	The thesis is accepted for the award of the Ph.D degree after minor revision	Yes/NO

The examiners of the thesis may send, along with their reports, suggestions on corrections and modifications and questions to be asked from the candidate by the Committee constituted for conducting the Viva-Voce examination.

- (c) If the examiner has recommended resubmission of the thesis, the Dean (Academics) shall accordingly advise the scholar through his/her supervisor. The candidate shall ordinarily resubmit the revised thesis within one year from the date on which the comments of the examiner(s) are provided to him/her. The response of the candidate shall be sent again to the examiner for a fresh assessment and recommendation.
- (d) If one of the examiners has recommended rejection of the thesis the Dean (Academics) may appoint a new examiner out of the panel. Provided the report of one of the external examiners is satisfactory.
- (e) If both the external examiners have recommended rejection of the thesis, the thesis shall be rejected out rightly.

12.22 Final Viva Voce

- (a) On having received the Thesis Assessment Report and recommendations from all examiners, the dean (Academics) shall request the Supervisor to arrange for the final viva voce.

- (b) The viva-voce committee shall comprise the external examiner from India and nominated member of DRC. The Dean (Academics) and the Supervisor(s) shall conduct the viva voce of the scholar on his/her thesis.
- (c) The viva-voce Committee shall provide to the candidate a list of all corrections and modifications, if any, suggested by the examiners.
- (d) The research scholar shall defend his/her thesis before the Viva Voce Committee. All queries raised by the examiners in their reports shall also have to be satisfactorily answered by the scholar.
- (e) The recommendations of the examiners shall be placed before the viva-voce Committee.
- (f) The Viva Voce Committee shall communicate its recommendations on the award of Ph.D degree to the Dean (Academic) through the Chairman.
- (g) In exceptional cases, if external examiners are not available for viva-voce examination, the dean (Academics) will appoint another external examiner for viva-voce committee, in consultation with Chairman Department Research Committee (DRC).

12.23 Honorarium, TA and DA to Examiners and Viva Voce Committee Members

Honorarium, TA and DA to examiners and Viva Voce Committee Members shall be paid according to rules of the University.

12.24 Declaration of Result

- (a) The Dean (Academics) shall advise the Department Research Committee (DRC) about the recommendations of the Viva Voce Committee and obtain the final approval of the Vice Chancellor for the award of the Ph.D. Degree.
- (b) The Dean (Academics) shall inform the Controller of Examinations (COE) about the approval of the Vice Chancellor.
- (c) The COE shall declare the result for the award of Ph.D degree and advise the scholar.
- (d) The Controller of Examinations (COE) shall issue a Provisional Certificate within one week of the declaration of the result.

12.25 Provisional Certificate

The University shall issue a Provisional Certificate Certifying to the effect that the M.Phil/Ph.D Degree has been awarded by Starex University to the candidate in accordance with the provisions of University Grants Commission (Minimum Standards and Procedure for award of M.Phil/Ph.D, Degree) Regulations, 2009 which will serve to purpose of Degree till the same is conferred on his/her on the University Convocation.

12.26 Depository with UGC

Following the successful completion of the evaluation process and announcement of the award of M.Phil./Ph.D Degree of the University shall submit a soft copy of the M.Phil/Ph.D thesis to the UGC within a period of thirty days, for hosting the same in INFLIBNET, accessible to institutions/Universities.

12.27 Amendment and Repeal of M.Phil/Ph.D Rules & Guidelines

Subject to the Haryana Private Universities Act 2006 as amended from time to time and statutes of the University, the University retains the right to change amend, suspend or repeal any part of these rules and guidelines for good reason and in the interest of academic standards and /or fairness to students.

12.28 Discipline


Every research scholar is required to observe decorum and disciplined behavior both inside and outside the campus and should not indulge in any activity which tend to tarnish the good name, prestige of Starex University. Any act of indiscipline of a research scholar shall be dealt in accordance with the rules of indiscipline of Starex University.

12.29 D.Sc. (Honoris Causa) and D.Lit. (Honoris Causa)

The honorary degrees Doctor of Science (D.Sc.) and Doctor of Letters (D.Lit.) may be awarded to eminent and distinguished persons who have made significant contributions to science, arts and Literature or any branch of human development with the prior approval of the Visitor. The proposals for award of such degrees can emanate sup moto in the Academic Council which shall be submitted to Board of Management for approval and subsequent approval of Chancellor. The Board of Management may consider the proposal and recommend the same to the Governing Body. The Governing Body shall take the final decision whether the proposal should be recommended for the approval of the Visitor. On approval of the Visitor the Degree will be awarded at the annual or a special convocation.

12.30 Dispute Redressal

In case of any dispute, the decision of the Vice Chancellor shall be final.

MINUTES

1. At the outset, the Chairman welcomed all the members of BOS and all special invitees.
2. Without any exception, all the schools handed over a complete set (a hard copy) of all the courses designed along with the ordinance prepared on the lines of directions given by the authorities concerned (of the University) the basic idea of opening a private university is to grant the autonomy under a particular framework and guidelines provided by the regulatory bodies. New course could be designed according to the condition of demand in the job market. In the broad framework, UGC has provided five category of courses- core courses, Discipline specific Elective courses (DSE), Ability enhancement courses (Eng/MIL, Environment science on the direction of Hon. supreme court to fulfill the objective of sustainable development, skills enhancement electives (to be designed so as to upgrade the skills that is application oriented skills in order to enhance their employability which is a function of a number of variables and attributes like knowledge, understanding overall personality, soft skills, family background effects made to develop oneself positive attitude and change variable) and the genetic elective courses meant for students of other disciplines(e.q. a student of mathematics might be having an interest and keen desire to learn literature, history, political sc. Etc.) since credit system has been adopted (1L+1C, 1T+1C and 1P+1/2C) semester grade point average and cumulative grade point average are to be worked out on the basis of weighted average and the performance of a student has to be classified in accordance with the grade point average.
3. All the faculty members and other officials including supporting staff have left no stone unturned in designing the course-structure as per norms of UGC under CBCS. The objective function is providing qualitative education as per the objective of the courses designed although the constraints at present are a challenge for all members of the university e.g this is the year of inception of the University, the luxury of offering a number of options cannot be afforded. Chairman, appreciated the efforts of all the members of the University in order to make all round personality development of students a step in the direction of rural development also.
4. Since the BOS has been constituted for the academic session 2017-18, the course-structure of all schools for both the semesters were approved unanimously after long discussion/deliberation modifications and were duly made as per valuable suggestions given by the board members.

Admission Instructions for NRI and Foreign Nationals:

NRI and Foreign national candidates seeking admission in different programmes at Starex University may follow the online and offline methods to apply as mentioned above, however, certain rules to be followed by NRI and foreign national candidates as mentioned below:

1. **Academic transcript translated in English** (if original transcript is in a language other than English), shall have to be **attested** by the **Indian Embassy of the candidate's country in India**.
2. **Passport** must show the name, address, validity and issuing authority.
3. The candidate shall also be required to submit **two letters of recommendation (LOR) from the faculty**, authority of their previous institutions or schools. In case of the application for undergraduate programme on LOR may preferably be from school counselor.
4. On receipt of Application Form, Starex University shall get the eligibility of the candidate confirmed for the applied academic programme and convey to the candidate if he/she is eligible for admission or not.
5. An eligible candidate in a particular programme shall be required to **deposit the fee through bank transfer after verification** of which the university shall issue provisional offer letter of admission to facilitate the candidate to apply for VISA.
6. In case, the candidate is asked to arrange the equivalence certificate from AIU (Association of Indian University) the charges would be borne by the candidate separately.
7. Admission shall be confirmed only after submission of all the verified documents as well as valid VISA copy along with fee payment.

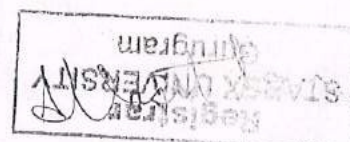
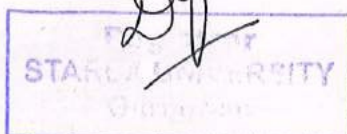

Chapter- 4

Committees and Boards

17. Finance Committee: Constitution, Powers & Functions

(i) The Finance Committee shall consist of the following members:-

(a) Vice Chancellor as ex-officio Chairperson

(b) Registrar ex-officio

(c) Financial Expert Member of the Governing Body as nominee of the Chancellor

(d) One nominee of the Board of Management

(e) Chief Finance and Accounts Officer as ex-officio Member-Secretary.

(ii) The Finance Committee shall meet at least twice each year. Quorum for the meeting will be three.

(iii) All members of the Finance Committee other than the ex-officio members shall hold office for a term of three years.

(iv) The Finance Committee shall have the following powers and functions:

(a) The annual accounts and financial estimates of the University shall be placed before the Finance Committee for consideration/ comments and thereafter shall be submitted to the Governing Body for its approval after consideration by the Board of Management.

(b) The Finance Committee shall, with the approval of the Board of Management, fix limits of the total recurring expenditure and the total non-recurring expenditure of the year, based on the income and resources of the University. No expenditure shall be incurred by the University in excess of the limits so fixed without specific approval of the Finance Committee and Board of Management.

(c) No expenditure other than that provided in the budget shall be incurred by the University without the approval of the Finance Committee and the Board of Management.

(d) The Finance Committee shall consider the proposal of the Fee Committee as specified in the Statutes/ Ordinances regarding the

fee structure and shall give its recommendations to the Board of Management for consideration and approval.

(e) The Finance Committee shall monitor expenses vis-à-vis approved budget.

(f) Any other power/functions prescribed in subsequent Statutes, Ordinances, Rules and Regulations.

18. Admission Committee

The University shall have an Admission Committee, which shall be constituted as under:

- (i) Vice Chancellor as Chairperson.
- (ii) Deans/ Principals/ Directors of Schools.
- (iii) Concerned Heads of Deptts.
- (iv) Chief Finance & Accounts Officer
- (v) Registrar as Member- Secretary

The Committee will decide the policy guidelines relating to admission to various courses as per the Act and prescription of the Regulating Bodies as specified under Clause 27 of the Statutes. The admission process will be undertaken by the Faculty/ Course wise Admission Committees.

The constitution of the Admission Committees and their powers and functions shall be provided by the Board of Management.

19. Fee Committee

The University shall have a Fee Committee, which shall be constituted as under:

- (i) Vice Chancellor as Chairperson
- (ii) Registrar
- (iii) Financial Expert outside the University, to be nominated by Chancellor, if need be.
- (iv) The Chief Finance and Accounts Officer shall be the Member Secretary.

The Fee Committee will prepare the fee structures and review them periodically. The recommendations of the Fee Committee will be considered by the Finance Committee and submitted to Board of Management for approval.

20. Selection Committees

There shall be Selection Committees constituted by the Chancellor for appointment of other University Officers, teaching and non-teaching/administrative staff as under:

(i) **Teaching Posts:** The Selection Committees for appointment to various teaching posts i.e. Professors, Associate Professors, Assistant Professors, shall be as per UGC norms and will be constituted as under:

- (a) Vice Chancellor as Chairperson
- (b) Dean of the Faculty/school
- (c) Head of the Department/Institutions (if he is a Professor or equivalent rank)
- (d) one/ two outside subject experts as per need.
- (e) Registrar as Secretary

Note: For promotion under Career Advancement Scheme of the UGC, the Selection Committee shall be as per UGC norms.

(ii) Registrar and Controller of Examinations and other equivalent officers:

- (a) Vice Chancellor as Chairperson
- (b) One nominee of the Sponsoring Body
- (c) Two/one outside expert(s) nominated by the Chancellor
- (d) Registrar as Secretary

Note: For appointment to the post of Registrar, Controller of Examinations will be Secretary.

(iii) For other Administrative and Non-teaching posts not below the rank of Superintendent:

- (a) Vice Chancellor as Chairperson
- (b) One nominee of the Sponsoring Body
- (c) One outside expert to be nominated by the Chancellor, if required.
- (d) Controller of Examinations



- (e) Chief Finance and Accounts Officer
- (f) Registrar as Member-Secretary
- (iv) For remaining ministerial staff:
 - (a) Registrar as Chairperson
 - (b) Chief Finance and Accounts Officer
 - (c) Controller of Examinations
 - (d) One nominee of the Sponsoring Body
 - (e) Jt/Dy Registrar as Member- Secretary

The quorum for Selection Committees for (i) and (ii) above shall be four of which two must be outsiders and three for (iii) & (iv).

The creation of the posts of other University officers, teaching and non-teaching/ administrative staff will be the Board of Management.

21. Departments

Each school of studies will have subject wise teaching departments as per need.

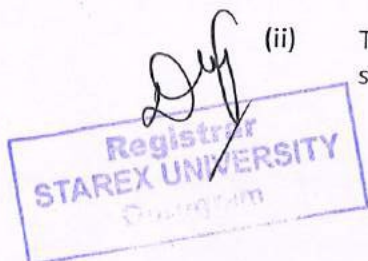
22. Heads of Departments

There will be a Head of Department who will be appointed by the Vice Chancellor, on rotation, from among the Associate Professors/Profs. in the department, for a period of three years.

23. Boards of Studies

- (i) There will be a Board of Studies for each School both UG & PG Courses comprising the following:
 - (a) Dean of the School as Chairperson
 - (b) All HODs/Professors of the concerned school
 - (c) Two Associate Professors of the concerned School
 - (d) One senior teacher as nominated by the Vice Chancellor in consultation with the Dean of the School
 - (e) One or more outside subject expert(s) nominated by the Vice Chancellor on the recommendation of the Dean of School, if need be.


- (ii) The Vice Chancellor may constitute the Board of Studies for the schools opened and to be opened by the University.



- (iii) Detailed syllabi of different courses of each school shall be Prepared by the Board of Studies and be submitted to the Academic Council for approval and subsequent publication.
- (iv) The meetings of the Board of Studies shall be held at least once in a year.

24. Other Committees

The authorities or the officers of the University may constitute such Committees with such terms & references as may be necessary for specific tasks to be prepared by such committees. The constitution of such committees and their duties shall be such as may be specified in the subsequent Statutes, Ordinances, Rules and Regulations.



Significant accounting policies and notes to the accounts for the year ended March 31, 2017

1 Significant accounting policies

a Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared and presented under the historical cost convention on the accrual basis of accounting except for certain financial instruments which are measured at fair values and comply with the Accounting Standards prescribed by Companies (Accounting Standards) Rules, 2006, as amended, other pronouncements of the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI) and the relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 1956, (the Act) to the extent applicable.

b Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with the generally accepted accounting principles ('GAAP') in India requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of income and expenses of the period, assets and liabilities and disclosures relating to contingent liabilities as of the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates. Any revision to accounting estimates is recognised prospectively in future periods.

c Revenue Recognition

Revenue from sale of goods is recognized on transfer of significant risks and rewards of ownership to the customer and when no significant uncertainty exists regarding realization of the consideration. Sales are recorded net of sales returns, rebates and trade discounts and price differences.

Interest : Interest on bank deposits is recognised on accrual basis.

Dividends : Revenue is recognised when the shareholders' right to receive payment is established by the balance sheet date. Dividend from subsidiaries is recognised even if same are declared after the balance sheet date but pertains to period on or before the date of balance sheet as per the requirement of schedule VI of the Companies Act, 1956

d Fixed Assets And Depreciation

i Fixed assets are stated at cost, less accumulated depreciation. Cost comprises the purchase price and any attributable cost of bringing the asset to its working condition for its intended use. Financing costs relating to acquisition of fixed assets are also included to the extent they relate to the period till such assets are ready to be put to use.

ii Depreciation is provided using the Straight - line method as per the useful lives of the assets estimated by the management, or at the rates prescribed under Schedule XIV of the Companies Act, 1956, whichever is higher.

Intangibles

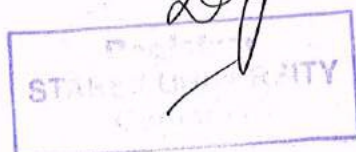
Software is stated at cost of acquisition and includes all attributable cost of bringing software to its working condition for its intended use.

e Inventories

Inventories are valued at lower of cost and net realizable value. costs include freight taxes duties and appropriate production overheads and are generally ascertained on the first in First out (FIFO) basis.

m Earnings per share

Basic earnings per share are calculated by dividing the net profit or loss for the year attributable to equity shareholders by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the year. For the purpose of calculating diluted earnings per share, the net profit or loss for the year attributable to equity shareholders and the weighted average number of shares outstanding during the year are adjusted for the effects of all dilutive potential equity shares.

Significant accounting policies and notes to the accounts for the year ended March 31, 2018

1 Significant accounting policies

a Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared and presented under the historical cost convention on the accrual basis of accounting except for certain financial instruments which are measured at fair values and comply with the Accounting Standards prescribed by Companies (Accounting Standards) Rules, 2006, as amended, other pronouncements of the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI) and the relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 1956, (the Act) to the extent applicable.

b Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with the generally accepted accounting principles ("GAAP") in India requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of income and expenses of the period, assets and liabilities and disclosures relating to contingent liabilities as of the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates. Any revision to accounting estimates is recognised prospectively in future periods.

c Revenue Recognition

Revenue from sale of goods is recognized on transfer of significant risks and rewards of ownership to the customer and when no significant uncertainty exists regarding realization of the consideration. Sales are recorded net of sales returns, rebates and trade discounts and price differences.

Interest : Interest on bank deposits is recognised on accrual basis.

Dividends : Revenue is recognised when the shareholders' right to receive payment is established by the balance sheet date. Dividend from subsidiaries is recognised even if same are declared after the balance sheet date but pertains to period on or before the date of balance sheet as per the requirement of schedule VI of the Companies Act, 1956

d Fixed Assets And Depreciation

i Fixed assets are stated at cost, less accumulated depreciation. Cost comprises the purchase price and any attributable cost of bringing the asset to its working condition for its intended use. Financing costs relating to acquisition of fixed assets are also included to the extent they relate to the period till such assets are ready to be put to use.

ii Depreciation is provided using the Straight - line method as per the useful lives of the assets estimated by the management, or at the rates prescribed under Schedule XIV of the Companies Act, 1956, whichever is higher.

Intangibles

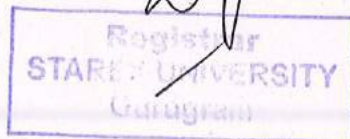
Software is stated at cost of acquisition and includes all attributable cost of bringing software to its working condition for its intended use.

e Inventories

Inventories are valued at lower of cost and net realizable value. costs include freight taxes duties and appropriate production overheads and are generally ascertained on the first in First out (FIFO) basis.

m Earnings per share

Basic earnings per share are calculated by dividing the net profit or loss for the year attributable to equity shareholders by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the year. For the purpose of calculating diluted earnings per share, the net profit or loss for the year attributable to equity shareholders and the weighted average number of shares outstanding during the year are adjusted for the effects of all dilutive potential equity shares.
